AN ACT to amend section 79-470, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, 1943, relating to schools; to specify the funds lost by a school district failing to maintain classes as required; to provide an exception; and to repeal the original section.

Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. That section 79-470, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, 1943, be amended to read as

79-470. No district shall receive any portion of the state funds pursuant to Chapter 79, article 13, unless school shall have been actually taught therein by a legally certificated teacher for the length of time required in-section-79-460 by law or unless the pupils residing therein have attended school in another district for the length of time required by law; Provided, in case of epidemic sickness or severe storm conditions prevailing to such an extent that the school board in any district shall deem it advisable to close any or all schools within the district, or if on account of the destruction of the schoolhouse it shall be impossible to continue the school, or at the discretion of the State Board of Education, such closing of the school shall not prevent it from drawing receiving its proper share of the state apportionment funds. Such sickness, storm conditions, or destruction of the district board and the oath filed with the county superintendent within ten days after the annual school meeting or election.

Sec. 2. That original section 79-470, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, 1943, is repealed.
