

# LEGISLATIVE BILL 1200A

Approved by the Governor April 15, 2024

Introduced by Moser, 22.

A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to appropriations; to amend sections 64 and 65, Legislative Bill 1412, One Hundred Eighth Legislature, Second Session, 2024; to reduce appropriations to aid in carrying out the provisions of Legislative Bill 1200, One Hundred Eighth Legislature, Second Session, 2024; to repeal the original sections; and to declare an emergency.

Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 64, Legislative Bill 1412, One Hundred Eighth Legislature, Second Session, 2024, is amended to read:

(1) The Department of Administrative Services shall monitor the appropriations and expenditures for this program according to the following program classifications:

- No. 264 - Children and Family Services Administration
- No. 265 - Protection and Safety
- No. 266 - Economic and Family Support
- No. 267 - Developmental Disabilities Service Coordination
- No. 268 - Behavioral Health Administration
- No. 269 - Developmental Disabilities Administration

(2) There is included in the appropriation to this program for FY2023-24 \$13,688 Cash Funds for regulatory support for out-of-hospital emergency care providers licensing from the Nebraska Health Care Cash Fund. There is included in the appropriation to this program for FY2024-25 \$13,688 Cash Funds for regulatory support for out-of-hospital emergency care providers licensing from the Nebraska Health Care Cash Fund.

(3) There is included in the appropriation to this program for FY2023-24 \$26,000 Cash Funds from the Nebraska Health Care Cash Fund to continue the Parkinson's Disease Registry. There is included in the appropriation to this program for FY2024-25 \$26,000 Cash Funds from the Nebraska Health Care Cash Fund to continue the Parkinson's Disease Registry.

(4) There is included in the appropriation to this program \$404,643 Cash Funds for FY2023-24 and \$404,643 Cash Funds for FY2024-25 from the Nebraska Health Care Cash Fund for respite services in each of the service areas designated by the Department of Health and Human Services and for administrative costs, including personnel costs, associated with the Nebraska Lifespan Respite Services Program.

(5) There is included in the appropriation to this program for FY2023-24 \$6,000 Cash Funds from the Nebraska Health Care Cash Fund for costs of smoking cessation covered by medicaid. There is included in the appropriation to this program for FY2024-25 \$6,000 Cash Funds from the Nebraska Health Care Cash Fund for costs of smoking cessation covered by medicaid.

(6) There is included in the appropriation to this program for FY2023-24 \$220,000 Cash Funds to operate a satellite office of minority health in the second and third congressional districts to coordinate and administer state policy relating to minority health from the Nebraska Health Care Cash Fund. There is included in the appropriation to this program for FY2024-25 \$220,000 Cash Funds to operate a satellite office of minority health in the second and third congressional districts to coordinate and administer state policy relating to minority health from the Nebraska Health Care Cash Fund.

(7) There is included in the appropriation to this program for FY2023-24 \$100,000 Cash Funds for staff and operating expenses for public health from the Nebraska Health Care Cash Fund. There is included in the appropriation to this program for FY2024-25 \$100,000 Cash Funds for staff and operating expenses for public health from the Nebraska Health Care Cash Fund.

(8) It is the intent of the Legislature that the Department of Health and Human Services provide quarterly status reports electronically on the replacement and maintenance, including expenditures, of the Medicaid Medical Information System (MMIS).

(9) It is the intent of the Legislature that the Department of Health and Human Services provide monthly status reports electronically to the Clerk of the Legislature and the Legislative Fiscal Analyst on medicaid expansion. The department shall include in the reports information on contracts, personnel, waiver applications, decisions and directives of the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services, and implementation timelines.

Sec. 3. Original sections 64 and 65, Legislative Bill 1412, One Hundred Eighth Legislature, Second Session, 2024, are repealed.

Sec. 4. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect when passed and approved according to law.
