

## LEGISLATIVE BILL 688

Approved by the Governor April 16, 1982

Introduced by Fowler, 27; Landis, 46; Wesely, 26

AN ACT to amend section 79-902.01, Revised Statutes Supplement, 1981, relating to schools; to change certain provisions relating to board of education elections; and to repeal the original section.

Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. That section 79-902.01, Revised Statutes Supplement, 1981, be amended to read as follows:

79-902.01. The board of education of a fourth class district shall consist of six members. Board members shall be elected for four years. Members of the board shall enter upon the duties of their office on the third Monday of the month in which they are elected. Vacancies in office shall occur as set forth in section 32-1037, or when a member elected from a district no longer resides in such election district. Whenever any vacancy occurs on the board, the remaining members shall appoint an individual residing within the geographical boundaries of the school district and within the geographical boundaries of the election district of the member whose term has become vacant in the manner prescribed in section 79-464. Candidates for the board of education shall be nominated and elected at the same time as members of the city council. No filing fee shall be required of such candidates. The election commissioner of the county in which the greater part of the district is situated shall, subject to review by the school board, divide the school district into six numbered districts, substantially equal in population as determined by the most recent federal census. The election commissioner shall consider the location of schools within the district and their boundaries. A member of the board shall be elected from each such district. Candidates shall be nominated from the district at the primary election upon a nonpolitical ballot. The names of the two candidates receiving the highest number of votes at such primary election in each district designated by the election commissioner shall be placed upon an official ballot for the board of education to be elected at large at the general city election. Members of the board of education shall serve until the expiration of their terms. At the general city election in 1979 and each four years thereafter, one member shall be elected from each of the even-numbered districts. At the general city election in 1981 and each four years

thereafter, one member shall be elected from each of the odd-numbered districts. The election commissioner shall adjust the boundaries of the election districts, subject to final review and adjustment by the school board, to conform to changes in the territory and population of the school district and also following each federal decennial census. Section 5-108 shall apply to all Class IV school districts.

Sec. 2. That original section 79-902.01, Revised Statutes Supplement, 1981, is repealed.
