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**Summary of purpose and/or changes:**

LB 560 permits the towing of motor vehicles on private property with the owner's permission and limits the fees related to towing.

Section by Section Summary

Section 1 amends Sec. 60-166 to provide harmonizing language.

Section 2 amends Sec. 60-2401 to cite the act as the Towing Regulation Act. In addition, if Omaha or Lincoln has not adopted a similar ordinance to this section, a motor vehicle within those cities that is parked on private property without the consent of the owner is subject to being towed away.

Section 3 amends Sec. 60-2401.01 to include a motor vehicle illegally parked on properly posted private property as subject to a traffic infraction and the towing of the vehicle. This section does not apply to Omaha and Lincoln.

Section 4 amends Sec. 60-2402 to require signs posted on private property to provide the appropriate contact information regarding a towed vehicle.

Section 5 amends Sec. 60-2403 to provide harmonizing language.

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Section 6 amends Sec. 60-2404 to require full compliance with the act in order for a vehicle to be subject to a lien disposition.

Section 7 amends Sec. 60-2405 to provide harmonizing language.

Section 8 amends Sec. 60-2406 to provide harmonizing language.

Section 9 amends Sec. 60-2407 to provide harmonizing language.

Section 10 amends Sec. 60-2408 to provide harmonizing language.
