LB 1090 provides for the State Department of Education (NDE) to award grants to sponsors for nonrecurring expenses incurred in initiating or expanding services under the Summer Food Service Program. Annual grants of up to $\$ 15,000$ are to be awarded on a competitive basis up to a total of $\$ 140,000$ per fiscal year. The bill defines sponsors eligible for grants and establishes priorities for the awarding of grants. Grant recipients must assure that grant funds are used to supplement state and local resources currently used to fund other child nutrition programs.

NDE is required to administer the grant program and submit an annual report to the Education Committee of the Legislature detailing the number of sponsors, sites used by sponsors, and children served. NDE indicates the department may not use federal child nutrition funds to administer the state grant award program. The department intends to contract for the administration of the program at a cost of $\$ 12,000$ general funds in 2012-13 and $\$ 10,000$ general funds in 2013-14.

No additional federal funds will be received by the state to fund the grant program. Annual grants will total $\$ 128,000$ of general funds in 2012-13 and $\$ 130,000$ of general funds in 2013-14. Grant recipients may include political subdivisions such as schools, cities, or counties or higher education entities which offer summer food service programs. Residential public or private nonprofit summer camps that provide food service may are also eligible for grants.
