A BILL

FOR AN ACT relating to the Medical Assistance Act; to amend section 2 68-901, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2010; to state intent; to require application for an amendment or 3 waiver related to the medicaid state plan; to authorize transfers of funds to the University of Nebraska Medical 5 Center; to harmonize provisions; and to repeal the 6 7 original section.

Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 68-901, Revised Statutes Cumulative

- 4 this act shall be known and may be cited as the Medical Assistance
- 5 Act.
- 6 Sec. 2. <u>The Legislature finds that:</u>
- 7 (1) The Nebraska Regional Poison Center funded through
- 8 <u>the University of Nebraska Medical Center Cash Fund provides a</u>
- 9 <u>valuable service to Nebraska;</u>
- 10 (2) The center receives over seventeen thousand calls
- 11 annually, seventy-two percent of the calls involve children, and over
- 12 <u>twenty-seven percent of the calls relate to children in families</u>
- 13 whose annual household income is at or below two hundred percent of
- 14 <u>the federal poverty level;</u>
- 15 (3) The operation of the center has resulted in over
- 16 ninety percent of the calls regarding a child under six years of age
- 17 being handled in a manner such that the child was able to remain at
- 18 home and the child did not have to visit an emergency room or use 911
- 19 or emergency medical services; and
- 20 (4) The operation of the center results in a cost savings
- 21 of one hundred seventy-five dollars per call in 1996 dollars.
- 22 Sec. 3. (1) On or before January 1, 2012, the department
- 23 shall submit an application to the federal Centers for Medicare and
- 24 Medicaid Services of the United States Department of Health and Human
- 25 Services to amend the medicaid state plan or seek a waiver to provide

for utilization of the unused administrative cap to allow for 1 payments to the Nebraska Regional Poison Center funded through the 2 3 University of Nebraska Medical Center Cash Fund to help offset the 4 cost for treatment of children who are eligible for assistance under 5 the medical assistance program and the Children's Health Insurance Program established pursuant to 42 U.S.C. 1397aa et seq., pursuant to 6 7 the federal Children's Health Insurance Program Reauthorization Act 8 of 2009, Public Law 111-3, as such act existed on January 1, 2010. 9 (2) Upon approval of the amendment to the medicaid state 10 plan or the granting of the waiver, the University of Nebraska 11 Medical Center shall transfer an amount, not to exceed two hundred 12 fifty thousand dollars, to the Health and Human Services Cash Fund 13 for the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services to meet the 14 state match to maximize the use of the unused administrative cap money. At the time the department receives the transferred amount or 15 16 any portion thereof and the corollary federal funds, the department 17 shall transfer the combined funds to the University of Nebraska Medical Center Cash Fund for operation of the Nebraska Regional 18 Poison Center. If no amendment is approved nor waiver granted or if 19 20 less than two hundred fifty thousand dollars is needed for the match, 21 then the University of Nebraska Medical Center may use the remaining 22 state appropriation for the operation of the Nebraska Regional Poison 23 Center. (3) The University of Nebraska Medical Center shall 24 25 report to the Legislative Fiscal Analyst on or before October 1 of LB 525
