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1 Sec. 2. (1) A board shall issue a license, certification,

- 2 or registration to a military-trained applicant to allow the
- 3 applicant to lawfully practice the applicant's occupation in this
- 4 state if, upon application to the board, the applicant satisfies the
- 5 following conditions:
- 6 (a) Has completed a military program of training, been
- 7 awarded a military occupational specialty, and performed in that
- 8 specialty at a level that is substantially equivalent to or exceeds
- 9 the requirements for licensure, certification, or registration of the
- 10 board for which the applicant is seeking licensure, certification, or
- 11 <u>registration in this state;</u>
- 12 (b) Has engaged in the active practice of the occupation
- 13 for which the person is seeking a license, certification, or permit
- 14 from the board in this state for at least two of the five years
- 15 preceding the date of the application under this section;
- 16 (c) Has not committed any act in any jurisdiction that
- 17 would have constituted grounds for refusal, suspension, or revocation
- 18 of a license to practice that occupation in this state at the time
- 19 the act was committed; and
- 20 (d) Pays any fees required by the board for which the
- 21 applicant is seeking licensure, certification, or registration in
- 22 this state.
- 23 (2) A board shall issue a license, certification, or
- 24 registration to a military spouse to allow the military spouse to
- 25 lawfully practice the military spouse's occupation in this state if,

1 upon application to the board, the military spouse satisfies the

- 2 following conditions:
- 3 (a) Holds a current license, certification, or
- 4 registration from another jurisdiction, and that jurisdiction's
- 5 requirements for licensure, certification, or registration are
- 6 substantially equivalent to or exceed the requirements for licensure,
- 7 <u>certification</u>, or registration of the board for which the applicant
- 8 <u>is seeking licensure, certification, or registration in this state;</u>
- 9 (b) Can demonstrate competency in the occupation through
- 10 methods as determined by the board, such as having completed
- 11 continuing education units or having had recent experience for at
- 12 <u>least two of the five years preceding the date of the application</u>
- 13 under this section;
- 14 (c) Has not committed any act in any jurisdiction that
- 15 would have constituted grounds for refusal, suspension, or revocation
- 16 of a license to practice that occupation in this state at the time
- 17 the act was committed;
- 18 (d) Is in good standing and has not been disciplined by
- 19 the agency that had jurisdiction to issue the license, certification,
- 20 or permit; and
- 21 (e) Pays any fees required by the board for which the
- 22 applicant is seeking licensure, certification, or registration in
- this state.
- 24 (3) All relevant experience of a military service member
- 25 in the discharge of official duties or, for a military spouse, all

1 relevant experience, including full-time and part-time experience,

- 2 regardless of whether in a paid or volunteer capacity, shall be
- 3 credited in the calculation of years of practice in an occupation as
- 4 required under subsection (1) or (2) of this section.
- 5 (4) A nonresident licensed, certified, or registered
- 6 under this section shall be entitled to the same rights and subject
- 7 to the same obligations as required of a resident licensed,
- 8 certified, or registered by a board in this state.
- 9 (5) A board may issue a temporary practice permit to a
- 10 military-trained applicant or military spouse licensed, certified, or
- 11 registered in another jurisdiction while the military-trained
- 12 applicant or military spouse is satisfying the requirements for
- 13 licensure under subsection (1) or (2) of this section if that
- 14 jurisdiction has licensure, certification, or registration standards
- 15 <u>substantially equivalent to the standards for licensure,</u>
- 16 certification, or registration of the board in this state. The
- 17 military-trained applicant or military spouse may practice under the
- 18 temporary permit until a license, certification, or registration is
- 19 granted or until a notice to deny a license, certification, or
- 20 registration is issued in accordance with rules and regulations
- 21 adopted and promulgated under the Uniform Credentialing Act.
- 22 (6) Nothing in this section shall be construed to
- 23 prohibit a military-trained applicant or military spouse from
- 24 proceeding under the other licensure, certification, or registration
- 25 requirements established under the Uniform Credentialing Act.

1 (7) This section shall not apply to licensure as a

- 2 physician and surgeon.
