Summary of purpose and/or changes:

Legislative Bill 416 would eliminate the teacher education allowance and state an intent to replace it with a system for rewarding teachers who take the initiative to improve their skills and knowledge with the goal of improving student achievement.

Section 79-1001 would be amended by adding the new provisions to the Tax Equity and Educational Opportunities Support Act (TEEOSA).

Section 79-1003 would be amended to harmonize the definition of adjusted general fund operating expenditures with the elimination of the teacher education allowance beginning with the calculation of aid for 2014-15.

Section 79-1007.25 would be amended by limiting the teacher education allowance to school fiscal years 2010-11 through 2013-14.

A new section would state an intent to replace the teacher education allowance by developing and establishing a system for rewarding teachers who take the initiative to improve their skills and knowledge with the goal of improving student achievement. The initiatives to improve skills and knowledge would include:

- 1. Attaining an advanced degree in the teacher's subject area field;
- 2. Attaining an endorsement in a teacher shortage area;
- 3. Attaining credentials to teach advanced placement courses;
- 4. Attaining credentials to teach in the International Baccalaureate program;
- 5. Attaining credentials to qualify as a master teacher pursuant to section 79-8,128;
- 6. Attaining credential to teach dual enrollment courses established by a school district and an accredited postsecondary educational institution located in Nebraska; or
- 7. Attaining an endorsement to teach courses in science, technology, engineering, or mathematics.
