This bill prohibits discrimination based on marital status or sexual orientation. Enforcement would be through the Equal Opportunity Commission.

An additional 60 to 80 cases a year are anticipated to be filed which is the standard caseload of an investigator. The cost is \$60,583 in FY 14 and \$59,321 in FY 15.

Cases that are duel-filed with the federal government are eligible for federal funds. Inclusion of marital status cases would be eligible, generating up to \$30,600 each year. However, the contract for the current year has not been signed and the contract rate is unknown at this time, so federal revenue may be less.
