1	FOR AN ACT relating to motor vehicles; to amend sections 60-3,113.04,
2	60-3,193.01, 60-462.01, 60-479.01, 60-4,147.02, 75-363,
3	75-364, 75-366, and 75-393, Revised Statutes Cumulative
4	Supplement, 2012; to adopt and update references to
5	certain federal provisions relating to handicapped or
6	disabled parking permits, persons handling source
7	documents, the International Registration Plan,
8	operators' licenses; hazardous materials, motor carrier
9	regulations and their enforcement, and the unified
10	carrier registration plan; and to repeal the original
11	sections.

12 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 60-3,113.04, Revised Statutes
 Cumulative Supplement, 2012, is amended to read:

3 60-3,113.04 (1) This section applies beginning on the 4 implementation date designated by the director under section 5 60-3,113.01.

6 (2) A handicapped or disabled parking permit shall be of 7 a design, size, configuration, color, and construction and contain 8 such information as specified in the regulations adopted by the 9 United States Department of Transportation in the Uniform System for 10 Parking for Persons with Disabilities, 23 C.F.R. part 1235, UNIFORM 11 <u>SYSTEM FOR PARKING FOR PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES,</u> as such regulations 12 existed on January 1, 2012. 2013.

13 (3) No handicapped or disabled parking permit shall be 14 issued to any person or for any motor vehicle if any permit has been 15 issued to such person or for such motor vehicle and such permit has 16 been suspended pursuant to section 18-1741.02. At the expiration of 17 such suspension, a permit may be renewed in the manner provided for 18 renewal in sections 60-3,113.02, 60-3,113.03, and 60-3,113.05.

19 (4) A duplicate handicapped or disabled parking permit 20 may be provided up to two times during any single permit period if a 21 permit is destroyed, lost, or stolen. Such duplicate permit shall be 22 issued as provided in section 60-3,113.02 or 60-3,113.03, whichever 23 is applicable, except that a new certification by a physician, a 24 physician assistant, or an advanced practice registered nurse need 25 not be provided. A duplicate permit shall be valid for the remainder

of the period for which the original permit was issued. All persons and agents of the department involved in the recording of verified application information or verified operator's license and state identification card information, involved in the manufacture or production of licenses or cards, or who have the ability to affect information on such licenses or cards shall be

5 ability to affect information on such licenses or cards shall be 6 7 subject to a criminal history record information check, including a 8 check of prior employment references, and a lawful status check as required by 6 C.F.R. part 37, as such part existed on January 1, 9 10 2012. 2013. Such persons and agents shall provide fingerprints which shall be submitted to the Federal Bureau of Investigation. The bureau 11 12 shall use its records for the criminal history record information 13 check.

(3) Upon receipt of a request pursuant to subsection (2) 14 15 of this section, the Nebraska State Patrol shall undertake a search 16 for criminal history record information relating to such applicant, including transmittal of the applicant's fingerprints to the Federal 17 Bureau of Investigation for a national criminal history record 18 information check. The criminal history record information check 19 20 shall include information concerning the applicant from federal 21 repositories of such information and repositories of such information in other states, if authorized by federal law. The Nebraska State 22 Patrol shall issue a report to the employing public agency that shall 23 include the criminal history record information concerning the 24 applicant. The cost of any background check shall be borne by the 25

2 (4) Any person convicted of any disqualifying offense as provided in 6 C.F.R. part 37, as such part existed on January 1, 3 2012, 2013, shall not be involved in the recording of verified 4 5 application information or verified operator's license and state 6 identification card information, involved in the manufacture or 7 production of licenses or cards, or involved in any capacity in which 8 such person would have the ability to affect information on such licenses or cards. Any employee or prospective employee of the 9 department shall be provided notice that he or she will undergo such 10 11 criminal history record information check prior to employment or 12 prior to any involvement with the issuance of operators' licenses or 13 state identification cards.

4 (6) Part 393 - Parts And Accessories Necessary For Safe 5 Operation PARTS AND ACCESSORIES NECESSARY FOR SAFE OPERATION and Part 6 396 - Inspection, Repair, And Maintenance INSPECTION, REPAIR, AND 7 MAINTENANCE shall not apply to fertilizer and agricultural chemical 8 application and distribution equipment transported in units with a 9 capacity of three thousand five hundred gallons or less.

10 (7) For purposes of this section, intrastate motor
11 carriers shall not include any motor carrier or driver excepted from
12 49 C.F.R. chapter III by section 390.3(f) of part 390.

13 (8)(a) Part 395 - Hours Of Service Of Drivers HOURS OF 14 <u>SERVICE OF DRIVERS</u> shall apply to motor carriers and drivers who 15 engage in intrastate commerce as defined in section 75-362, except 16 that no motor carrier who engages in intrastate commerce shall permit 17 or require any driver used by it to drive nor shall any driver drive: 18 (i) More than twelve hours following eight consecutive 19 hours off duty; or

20 (ii) For any period after having been on duty sixteen21 hours following eight consecutive hours off duty.

(b) No motor carrier who engages in intrastate commerce shall permit or require a driver of a commercial motor vehicle, regardless of the number of motor carriers using the driver's services, to drive, nor shall any driver of a commercial motor

vehicle drive, for any period after: 1

2 (i) Having been on duty seventy hours in any seven 3 consecutive days if the employing motor carrier does not operate 4 every day of the week; or

5 (ii) Having been on duty eighty hours in any period of 6 eight consecutive days if the employing motor carrier operates motor 7 vehicles every day of the week.

8 (9) Part 395 - Hours Of Service Of Drivers, HOURS OF SERVICE OF DRIVERS, as adopted in subsections (3) and (8) of this 9 section, shall not apply to drivers transporting agricultural 10 11 commodities or farm supplies for agricultural purposes when the 12 transportation of such commodities or supplies occurs within a one-13 hundred-air-mile radius of the source of the commodities or the distribution point for the supplies when such transportation occurs 14 15 during the period beginning on February 15 up to and including 16 December 15 of each calendar year.

(11) 49 C.F.R. 392.9a - Operating Authority shall not 22 apply to Nebraska motor carriers operating commercial motor vehicles 23 24 solely in intrastate commerce.

7 75-366 For the purpose of enforcing Chapter 75, article 8 3, any officer of the Nebraska State Patrol may, upon demand, inspect 9 the accounts, records, and equipment of any motor carrier or shipper. Any officer of the Nebraska State Patrol shall have the authority to 10 11 enforce the federal motor carrier safety regulations, as such 12 regulations existed on January 1, 2012, 2013, and federal hazardous 13 materials regulations, as such regulations existed on January 1, 14 2012, 2013, and is authorized to enter upon, inspect, and examine any and all lands, buildings, and equipment of any motor carrier, any 15 16 shipper, and any other person subject to the federal Interstate 17 Commerce Act, the federal Department of Transportation Act, and other 18 related federal laws and to inspect and copy any and all accounts, books, records, memoranda, correspondence, and other documents of a 19 20 motor carrier, a shipper, and any other person subject to Chapter 75, 21 article 3, for the purposes of enforcing Chapter 75, article 3.
