A BILL

1 FOR AN ACT relating to the Motor Vehicle Operator's License Act; to
2 amend sections 32-308, 60-474, 60-484.02, 60-4,119,
3 60-4,180, and 60-2904, Reissue Revised Statutes of
4 Nebraska, and sections 60-4,115, 60-4,116, 60-4,120,
5 60-4,122, 60-4,126, and 60-4,150, Revised Statutes
6 Cumulative Supplement, 2012; to redefine terms; to change
7 operator's license renewal procedures for persons out of
8 the state; to change and eliminate provisions relating to
9 issuance of duplicate and replacement operators' licenses
10 and state identification cards; to harmonize provisions;
11 and to repeal the original sections.

12 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 32-308, Reissue Revised Statutes of
2 Nebraska, is amended to read:

3 32-308 (1) The Secretary of State and the Director of
4 Motor Vehicles shall enter into an agreement to match information in
5 the computerized statewide voter registration list with information
6 in the data base of the Department of Motor Vehicles to the extent
7 required to enable each such official to verify the accuracy of the
8 information provided on applications for voter registration. The
9 Director of Motor Vehicles shall enter into an agreement with the
10 Commissioner of Social Security under section 205(r)(8) of the
11 federal Social Security Act, 42 U.S.C. 405(r)(8), as such section
12 existed on April 17, 2003, for purposes of the Election Act.

13 (2) The Department of Motor Vehicles, with the assistance
14 of the Secretary of State, shall prescribe a voter registration
15 application which may be used to register to vote or change his or
16 her address for voting purposes at the same time an elector applies
17 for an original or renewal motor vehicle operator's license, an
18 original or renewal state identification card, or a replacement ~~or~~
19 ~~duplicate~~ thereof. The voter registration application shall contain
20 the information required pursuant to section 32-312 and shall be
21 designed so that it does not require the duplication of information
22 in the application for the motor vehicle operator's license or state
23 identification card, except that it may require a second signature of
24 the applicant. The department and the Secretary of State shall make
25 the voter registration application available to the county treasurer,

1 the license examiners of the department, and any other person who
2 issues operators' licenses or state identification cards. The
3 application shall be completed at the office of the county treasurer
4 or department by the close of business on the third Friday preceding
5 any election to be registered to vote at such election. A
6 registration application received after the deadline shall not be
7 processed by the election commissioner or county clerk until after
8 the election.

9 (3) State agency personnel and county treasurers involved
10 in the voter registration process pursuant to this section and
11 section 32-309 shall not be considered deputy registrars or agents or
12 employees of the election commissioner or county clerk.

13 Sec. 2. Section 60-474, Reissue Revised Statutes of
14 Nebraska, is amended to read:

15 60-474 Operator's or driver's license shall mean any
16 license or permit to operate a motor vehicle issued under the laws of
17 this state, including:

18 (1) Any replacement ~~or duplicate~~ license or instruction
19 permit;

20 (2) The privilege of any person to drive a motor vehicle
21 whether such person holds a valid license;

22 (3) Any nonresident's operating privilege which shall
23 mean the privilege conferred upon a nonresident by the laws of this
24 state pertaining to the operation of a motor vehicle in this state by
25 such person or the use in this state of a vehicle owned by such

1 person;

2 (4) An employment driving permit issued as provided by
3 sections 60-4,129 and 60-4,130; and

4 (5) A medical hardship driving permit issued as provided
5 by sections 60-4,130.01 and 60-4,130.02.

6 Sec. 3. Section 60-484.02, Reissue Revised Statutes of
7 Nebraska, is amended to read:

8 60-484.02 (1) Each applicant for an operator's license or
9 state identification card shall have his or her digital image ~~taken~~.
10 captured. Digital images shall be preserved for use as prescribed in
11 sections 60-4,119, 60-4,151, and 60-4,180. The images shall be used
12 for issuing operators' licenses and state identification cards. The
13 images may be retrieved only by the Department of Motor Vehicles for
14 issuing renewal, ~~duplicate~~, and replacement operators' licenses and
15 state identification cards and may not be otherwise released except
16 in accordance with subsection (3) of this section.

17 (2) Upon application for an operator's license or state
18 identification card, each applicant shall provide his or her
19 signature in a form prescribed by the department. Digital signatures
20 shall be preserved for use on original, renewal, ~~duplicate~~, and
21 replacement operators' licenses and state identification cards and
22 may not be otherwise released except in accordance with subsection
23 (3) of this section.

24 (3) No officer, employee, agent, or contractor of the
25 department or law enforcement officer shall release a digital image

1 or a digital signature except to a federal, state, or local law
2 enforcement agency, a certified law enforcement officer employed in
3 an investigative position by a federal, state, or local agency, or a
4 driver licensing agency of another state for the purpose of carrying
5 out the functions of the agency or assisting another agency in
6 carrying out its functions upon the verification of the identity of
7 the person requesting the release of the information and the
8 verification of the purpose of the requester in requesting the
9 release. Any officer, employee, agent, or contractor of the
10 department or law enforcement officer that knowingly discloses or
11 knowingly permits disclosure of a digital image or digital signature
12 in violation of this section shall be guilty of a Class I
13 misdemeanor.

14 Sec. 4. Section 60-4,115, Revised Statutes Cumulative
15 Supplement, 2012, is amended to read:

16 60-4,115 (1) Fees for operators' licenses and state
17 identification cards shall be collected and distributed according to
18 the table in subsection (2) of this section, except for the ignition
19 interlock permit and associated fees as outlined in subsection (4) of
20 this section. County officials shall remit the county portion of the
21 fees collected to the county treasurer for placement in the county
22 general fund. All other fees collected shall be remitted to the State
23 Treasurer for credit to the appropriate fund.

24 (2) The fees provided in this subsection in the following
25 dollar amounts apply for operators' licenses and state identification

7 (3) If the department issues an operator's license or a
 8 state identification card, the department shall remit the county
 9 portion of the fees to the State Treasurer for credit to the
 10 Department of Motor Vehicles Cash Fund.

11 (4)(a) The fee for an ignition interlock permit shall be
 12 forty-five dollars. Five dollars of the fee shall be remitted to the
 13 State Treasurer for credit to the Department of Motor Vehicles Cash
 14 Fund. Forty dollars of the fee shall be remitted to the State
 15 Treasurer for credit to the Department of Motor Vehicles Ignition
 16 Interlock Fund.

17 (b) The fee for a ~~duplicate or replacement~~ ignition
 18 interlock permit shall be eleven dollars. Two dollars and seventy-
 19 five cents of the fee shall be remitted to the county treasurer for
 20 credit to the county general fund. Six dollars of the fee shall be
 21 remitted to the State Treasurer for credit to the Department of Motor
 22 Vehicles Cash Fund. Two dollars and twenty-five cents of the fee
 23 shall be remitted to the State Treasurer for credit to the General
 24 Fund.

1 (c) The fee for adding, changing, or removing a class,
2 endorsement, or restriction on an ignition interlock permit shall be
3 five dollars. The fee shall be remitted to the State Treasurer for
4 credit to the Department of Motor Vehicles Cash Fund.

5 (5) The department and its agents may collect an identity
6 security surcharge to cover the cost of security and technology
7 practices used to protect the identity of applicants for and holders
8 of operators' licenses and state identification cards and to reduce
9 identity theft, fraud, and forgery and counterfeiting of such
10 licenses and cards to the maximum extent possible. The surcharge
11 shall be in addition to all other required fees for operators'
12 licenses and state identification cards. The amount of the surcharge
13 shall be determined by the department. The surcharge shall not exceed
14 eight dollars. The surcharge shall be remitted to the State Treasurer
15 for credit to the Department of Motor Vehicles Cash Fund.

16 Sec. 5. Section 60-4,116, Revised Statutes Cumulative
17 Supplement, 2012, is amended to read:

18 60-4,116 Prior to the issuance of any original or renewal
19 operator's license, the issuance of a replacement ~~or duplicate~~
20 operator's license, or the reissuance of any such license with a
21 change of any classification, endorsement, or restriction, the
22 department shall:

23 (1) Check the driving record of the applicant as
24 maintained by the department or by any other state which has issued
25 an operator's license to the applicant;

1 (2) Contact the Commercial Driver License Information
2 System to determine whether the applicant possesses any valid
3 commercial driver's license issued by any other state, whether such
4 license or the applicant's privilege to operate a commercial motor
5 vehicle has been suspended, revoked, or canceled, or whether the
6 applicant has been disqualified from operating a commercial motor
7 vehicle; and

8 (3) Contact the National Driver Register to determine if
9 the applicant (a) has been disqualified from operating any motor
10 vehicle, (b) has had an operator's license suspended, revoked, or
11 canceled, (c) is not eligible, or (d) is deceased.

13 Nebraska, is amended to read:

14 60-4,119 (1) All state identification cards and
15 operators' licenses, except farm permits, ~~and except as otherwise~~
16 ~~provided in subsection (2) of this section and section 60-4,120,~~
17 shall include a ~~color photograph or a digital image~~ and a digital
18 signature of the cardholder or licensee as provided in section
19 60-484.02. ~~State Receipts for state~~ identification cards and
20 operators' licenses shall be issued by the county treasurer or the
21 Department of Motor Vehicles. The director shall negotiate and enter
22 into a contract to provide the necessary equipment, supplies, and
23 forms for the issuance of the licenses and cards. All costs incurred
24 by the Department of Motor Vehicles under this section shall be paid
25 by the state out of appropriations made to the department. All costs

1 of ~~taking capturing~~ the ~~photographs or~~ digital images and digital

16 (3) In the event a mutilated ~~and~~or unreadable operator's
17 license is held by any person duly licensed under the act or a

20 replacement license or card. ~~upon showing the original mutilated or~~
21 ~~unreadable license or card to the department. A replacement license~~
22 ~~or card may be issued, without a photograph, to any person who is out~~

7 (4) If any person duly licensed under the act loses his
8 or her operator's license or if any holder of a state identification
9 card loses his or her card while temporarily out of the state, he or

12 and reporting such loss. Upon receipt of a correctly completed
13 application, the department shall cause to be issued, ~~upon the~~
14 ~~payment of the fee prescribed in section 60-4,115, a duplicate~~

16 ~~of the duplicate, the original license or card shall be void.~~

17 (5) Any person ~~holding~~ who holds a valid operator's

21 day period, such license or card shall be considered invalid and no
22 license or card shall be issued until the individual has made

2 (6) ~~An application form~~ Application for a replacement or
3 ~~duplicate~~ operator's license or state identification card shall
4 include a voter registration portion pursuant to section 32-308 and

6 part of this application process? the information required under
7 sections 60-484 and 60-484.04.

8 (7) An applicant may obtain a replacement or ~~duplicate~~
9 operator's license or state identification card pursuant to
10 subsection (1), or (3), or (4) of this section by electronic means in
11 a manner prescribed by the department. If No replacement license or
12 card shall be issued unless the applicant has a digital image and
13 digital signature preserved in the digital system, the replacement
14 or duplicate shall be issued with the preserved digital image and
15 digital signature.

16 (8) Each replacement operator's license or state
17 identification card shall be issued with the same expiration date as
18 the license or card for which the replacement is issued. The
19 replacement license or card shall also state the new issuance date.
20 Upon issuance of any replacement license or card, the license or card
21 for which the replacement is issued shall be void.

22 (9) A replacement operator's license or state
23 identification card issued under this section shall be delivered to
24 the applicant as provided in section 60-4,113 after the county
25 treasurer or department collects the fee and surcharge prescribed in

1 section 60-4,115 and issues the applicant a receipt with driving
2 privileges which is valid for up to thirty days.

3 Sec. 8. Section 60-4,122, Revised Statutes Cumulative
4 Supplement, 2012, is amended to read:

5 60-4,122 (1) Except as otherwise provided in subsections
6 (2), (3), and (8) of this section, no original or renewal operator's
7 license shall be issued to any person until such person has
8 demonstrated his or her ability to operate a motor vehicle safely as
9 provided in section 60-4,114.

10 (2) Except as otherwise provided in this section and
11 section 60-4,127, any person who renews his or her Class O or Class M
12 license shall demonstrate his or her ability to drive and maneuver a
13 motor vehicle safely as provided in subdivision (3)(b) of section
14 60-4,114 only at the discretion of department personnel, except that
15 a person required to use bioptic or telescopic lenses shall be
16 required to demonstrate his or her ability to drive and maneuver a
17 motor vehicle safely each time he or she renews his or her license.

18 (3) Any person who renews his or her Class O or Class M
19 license prior to or within one year after its expiration may not be
20 required to demonstrate his or her knowledge of the motor vehicle
21 laws of this state as provided in subdivision (3)(c) of section
22 60-4,114 if his or her driving record abstract maintained in the
23 computerized records of the department shows that such person's
24 license is not impounded, suspended, revoked, or canceled.

25 (4) Except for operators' licenses issued to persons

1 required to use bioptic or telescopic lenses, any person who renews
2 his or her operator's license which has been valid for fifteen months
3 or less shall not be required to take any examination required under
4 section 60-4,114.

5 (5) Any person who renews a state identification card
6 shall appear before department personnel and present his or her
7 current state identification card or shall follow the procedure for
8 electronic renewal in subsection (9) of this section. Proof of
9 identification shall be required as prescribed in sections 60-484 and
10 60-4,181 and also, ~~beginning on an implementation date designated by~~
11 ~~the director on or before January 1, 2014,~~ the information and
12 documentation required by section 60-484.04.

13 (6) A nonresident who applies for an initial operator's
14 license in this state and who holds a valid operator's license from
15 another state which is his or her state of residence may not be
16 required to demonstrate his or her knowledge of the motor vehicle
17 laws of this state if he or she surrenders to the department his or
18 her valid out-of-state operator's license.

19 (7) An applicant for an original operator's license may
20 not be required to demonstrate his or her knowledge of the motor
21 vehicle laws of this state if he or she has been issued a Nebraska
22 LPD-learner's permit that is valid or has been expired for no more
23 than one year. The written examination shall not be waived if the
24 original operator's license being applied for contains a class or
25 endorsement which is different from the class or endorsement of the

1 Nebraska LPD-learner's permit.

2 (8)(a) A qualified licensee as determined by the
3 department who is twenty-one years of age or older, whose license
4 expires prior to his or her seventy-second birthday, and who has a
5 digital image and digital signature preserved in the digital system
6 may renew his or her Class O or Class M license once by electronic
7 means in a manner prescribed by the department using the preserved
8 digital image and digital signature without taking any examination
9 required under section 60-4,114 if such renewal is prior to or within
10 one year after the expiration of the license, if his or her driving
11 record abstract maintained in the records of the department shows
12 that such person's license is not impounded, suspended, revoked, or
13 canceled, and if his or her driving record indicates that he or she
14 is otherwise eligible. Every licensee, including a licensee who is
