Summary of purpose and/or changes:

Amends section 60-370; county designation on motor vehicle license plates.

The section prescribes the list of county license plates designation numbers.

The section currently provides that in counties over 100,000 population (Douglas, Sarpy, and Lancaster) license plates shall be issued using the alphanumeric system rather that the county number system. (In all other counties the county board has the option of using the alphanumeric system for license plates.)

The bill amends the section as follows:

- 1) Current law requires that farm trucks be registered using the county number system in all counties, even those counties which employ alphanumeric license plate designation. This requirement is eliminated- therefore in counties using alphanumeric license plates, farm trucks will also display alphanumeric plates. Farm trucks will still be required to display the words "FARM TRUCK" "NOT FOR HIRE" and the appropriate tonnage sticker.
- 2)Amends the rule and regulation authority of the Department of Motor Vehicles. Language is added concerning rules regarding alphanumeric license plates. The department may designate plate types that shall display county numbers on a statewide basis, taking into consideration cost, the need for uniformity, factors applicable to production, distribution, the use of plate types and any other factors the director of motor vehicles deems relevant; and

3) The bill has an operative date of January 1, 2017.
