Any Fiscal Notes received from state agencies and political subdivisions are attached following the Legislative Fiscal Analyst Estimate.

As amended, LB 1038 would have the following fiscal impact:

Riparian Vegetation Management Task Force – AM 2472 to LB 1038 would establish legislative intent that the Riparian Vegetation Management Task Force be funded at a level of \$1,000,000 per year beginning in FY16-17. The purpose of the appropriation would be to manage vegetation within the banks of a natural stream or within 100 feet of the banks of a channel of any natural stream. Am 2472 specifies the membership of the Riparian Vegetation Management Task Force and provides that the task force be administratively housed within the Department of Agriculture. Administrative costs would be limited to \$25,000 of the total appropriation. Costs would come from the General Fund, with \$975,000 earmarked as state aid. It is anticipated that the Department of Agriculture could utilize existing staff to carry out riparian vegetation management functions.

**Hydropower water appropriations changed to instream basin management appropriations** – AM 2472 to LB 1038 would amend sections of law governing water appropriations to allow that an appropriation for the manufacturing of hydropower could be changed to an instream basin management appropriation to be held jointly by the Game and Parks Commission and any natural resources district or a combination of natural resources districts. AM 2472 establishes provisions for the calculation of just compensation to be paid in the event that such a change is approved.

Because these provisions are permissive, the timing of any fiscal impact to the Game and Parks Commission and natural resources districts would depend upon when such an agreement is reached between applicable parties. It is estimated that there would be a one-time fiscal impact to natural resources districts to carry out just compensation. Any potential fiscal impact to the Game and Parks Commission would also depend upon the timing and nature of compensation agreements. It is anticipated that the Game and Parks Commission could make application to existing sources of cash-funded state aid grant programs to meet any possible funding requirements related to just compensation. It is estimated that the Department of Natural Resources could carry out the regulatory provisions of AM 2472 with existing staffing and budgetary resources.

**Vegetation control** -- AM2688, which is LB 639, requires the Department of Roads to establish a program that allows permits to be issued for the control of vegetation in the vicinity of advertising signs, displays, or devices that are placed along highways. A permit issued under this authorization would allow the cutting, trimming, or spraying of vegetation under controlled conditions. The permit fee cannot exceed \$50.

The fiscal note from the Department of Roads (attached as LB639 AM2025) estimates it will take 16 hours to perform the work necessary to issue a permit and perform a post activity inspection at a related cost of \$320. This is based on an average wage of \$20 per hour. These costs represent employee time charged to this activity but are not actual increases in expenditures. Based on the department's estimated cost of \$320 to issue a permit, if the permit fee is set at the maximum amount of \$50 the department will be subsidizing \$270 of the issuance costs. No estimate is available on the number of permits that will be issued.

The cost to write rules and regulations are estimated by the department to cost \$1,600. Again, these costs represent an employee's time charged to this activity but are not actual increases in expenditures.

**Niobrara Council** -- AM2675, which is LB 1019, makes three changes to the statutes involving the Niobrara Council. (The fiscal note from the Game and Parks Commission is attached as LB1019.)

The first change would require Legislative confirmation of appointments made to serve on the Council. Assuming that current members who are reappointed would be reimbursed for their travel costs to attend their confirmation hearing the Council's expenditures would increase during those years that there were in fact reappointments. In July, 2018, seven members are up for reappointment, travel reimbursement if all seven are reappointed are estimated to be \$3,700. This estimate includes an overnight stay, meals, and mileage reimbursement. The cost would be incurred during the 2019 Legislative session and fall in FY2018-19.

The second change impacts the amount of assistance that the Game and Parks Commission is allowed to provide to the Niobrara Council. Current statute limits this assistance to administrative support and limits this support to \$50,000 in any calendar year. LB 1019 expands the allowed support to include "budgetary, operational, and programmatic" support and eliminates the \$50,000 cap. Since the statute provides that the Game and Parks Commission "may" provide this additional support it is not believed that this provision will alter the current relationship between the Council and the Commission and will not have a fiscal impact. If the Commission did decide to expand the amount of assistance provided to the Council there would be a fiscal impact, but this is not required by the bill.

The third change requires the Council to electronically submit an annual report on their expenditures to the Legislature. This requirement has no fiscal impact.

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although unknown since it would be dependent upon the Council's request for assistance and the Commission's ability to provide same. Currently any administrative support (presumed to be staff time for budget submittal and payment processing) provided is limited to \$50,000 in any calendar year. The proposed legislation would eliminate this limit. It is not thought that this limit relates to Aid appropriations granted the Council through the budgetary process.

The proposed legislation would also require the Council to provide the Legislature (Clerk of the Legislature and Chair of Natural Resources Committee) an annual report (due each December 1, beginning in 2016) describing expenditures made pursuant to the Niobrara Scenic River Act. It is presumed that this new requirement would be accomplished at the expense of other duties.
