Any Fiscal Notes received from state agencies and political subdivisions are attached following the Legislative Fiscal Analyst Estimate.

This bill requires the establishment of a prescription drug monitoring system. The system is to be implemented beginning on January 1, 2017. The system shall include the following provisions: 1) prohibits patients from opting out; 2) requires all prescriptions and controlled substances to be entered into the system; 3) allows all prescribers and dispensers to access the system at no cost to the subscriber or dispenser and 4) ensures that the system has information on all payors.

There is no cost to the state. The Department of Health and Human Services has secured two grants that will cover implementation and ongoing maintenance costs. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention awarded the State \$750,000 for four years. HHS also received a Harold Rogers Grant for \$500,000 for two years.
