- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to state disasters; to adopt the Facilitating
- 2 Business Rapid Response to State Declared Disasters Act.
- 3 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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1 Section 1. Sections 1 to 5 of this act shall be known and may be

- 2 cited as the Facilitating Business Rapid Response to State Declared
- 3 Disasters Act.
- 4 Sec. 2. For purposes of the Facilitating Business Rapid Response to
- 5 State Declared Disasters Act:
- 6 (1) Declared state disaster or emergency means a disaster or
- 7 emergency event (a) for which a Governor's state of emergency
- 8 proclamation has been issued or (b) that the President of the United
- 9 States has declared to be a major disaster or emergency;
- 10 (2) Disaster period means the period of time that begins ten days
- 11 <u>before the Governor's proclamation of a state of emergency or the</u>
- 12 <u>declaration by the President of the United States of a major disaster or</u>
- 13 emergency, whichever occurs first, and extending for a period of sixty
- 14 calendar days following the end of the period specified in the
- 15 proclamation or declaration or sixty calendar days after the proclamation
- 16 or declaration if no end is provided. The Governor may extend the
- 17 disaster period as warranted;
- 18 (3) Infrastructure means real and personal property, including
- 19 buildings, offices, power lines, cable lines, poles, communication lines,
- 20 pipes, structures, equipment, and related support facilities, owned or
- 21 used by a public utility, communications network, broadband or Internet
- 22 service provider, cable or video service provider, natural gas
- 23 distribution system, or water pipeline that provides service to more than
- 24 <u>one customer or person;</u>
- 25 (4)(a) Out-of-state business means a business entity:
- 26 (i) That does not have a presence in the state;
- 27 <u>(ii) That does not conduct business in the state;</u>
- 28 (iii) That has no registrations, tax filings, or nexus in the state
- 29 <u>before the declared state disaster or emergency; and</u>
- 30 (iv) Whose assistance in repairing, renovating, installing, or
- 31 <u>building infrastructure or rendering services or other business</u>

- 1 activities related to a declared state disaster or emergency is requested
- 2 by the state, a county, city, village, or other political subdivision of
- 3 the state, or a registered business that owns or uses infrastructure.
- 4 (b) Out-of-state business includes a business entity that is
- 5 affiliated with a registered business solely through common ownership as
- 6 <u>long</u> as that business entity does not have any registrations, tax
- 7 filings, or nexus in the state before the declared state disaster or
- 8 emergency. For purposes of this section, a prior registration as an out-
- 9 of-state business for a declared state disaster or emergency shall not be
- 10 considered a registration in this state;
- 11 (5) Out-of-state employee means a nonresident individual who does
- 12 <u>not work in the state except for disaster or emergency related work</u>
- 13 <u>during a disaster period; and</u>
- 14 (6) Registered business means a business entity that is registered
- or licensed to do business in the state before the declared state
- 16 disaster or emergency.
- 17 Sec. 3. <u>(1) An out-of-state business that conducts operations</u>
- 18 within the state for purposes of assisting in repairing, renovating,
- 19 installing, or building infrastructure or rendering services or other
- 20 business activities related to a declared state disaster or emergency
- 21 during the disaster period shall not be considered to have established a
- 22 level of presence that would subject the out-of-state business or any of
- 23 <u>its out-of-state employees to any of the following state or local</u>
- 24 employment, licensing, or registration requirements:
- 25 (a) Registration with the Secretary of State;
- 26 (b) Withholding or income tax registration, filing, or remitting
- 27 requirements; and
- 28 (c) Sales, use, or ad valorem tax on equipment brought into the
- 29 state temporarily for use or consumption during the disaster period if
- 30 such equipment does not remain in the state after the disaster period.
- 31 (2) An out-of-state employee shall not be considered to have

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- 1 established residency or a presence in the state that would require that
- 2 person or that person's employer to file and pay income taxes, to be
- 3 subjected to tax withholdings, or to file and pay any other state or
- 4 local income or withholding tax or fee for work repairing, renovating,
- 5 installing, or building infrastructure or rendering services or other
- 6 business activities during the disaster period.
- 7 (3) After the conclusion of a disaster period, an out-of-state
- 8 business or out-of-state employee that remains in the state is fully
- 9 subject to the state or local employment, licensing, or registration
- 10 requirements listed in this section or that were otherwise suspended
- 11 <u>under the Facilitating Business Rapid Response to State Declared</u>
- 12 <u>Disasters Act during the disaster period.</u>
- 13 Sec. 4. (1) An out-of-state business shall provide notification to
- 14 the Department of Revenue within ten days after entry to the state during
- 15 a disaster period that the out-of-state business is in the state for
- 16 purposes of responding to the declared state disaster or emergency. The
- 17 out-of-state business shall provide to the department information related
- 18 to the out-of-state business including, but not limited to, the
- 19 <u>following:</u>
- 20 <u>(a) Name;</u>
- 21 (b) State of domicile;
- 22 (c) Principal business address;
- 23 (d) Federal employer identification number;
- 24 (e) The date when the out-of-state business entered the state; and
- 25 (f) Contact information while the out-of-state business is in this
- 26 state.
- 27 (2) A registered business shall provide the notification required in
- 28 subsection (1) of this section for an affiliate of the registered
- 29 business that enters the state as an out-of-state business. The
- 30 notification under this subsection shall also include contact information
- 31 for the registered business in the state.

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- Sec. 5. The Facilitating Business Rapid Response to State Declared
- 2 <u>Disasters Act shall not grant exemptions authorized by the act to any</u>
- 3 out-of-state business performing work pursuant to a request for bid or
- 4 <u>request for proposals by a state agency or political subdivision.</u>
