- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to aliens; to amend sections 4-111 and 4-112,
- 2 Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and section 38-129, Revised
- 3 Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2014; to state intent relating to
- 4 professional or commercial licenses; to provide for issuance of
- 5 credentials as prescribed; to harmonize provisions; to repeal the
- 6 original sections; and to declare an emergency.
- 7 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 4-111, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
2 amended to read:

3 4-111 (1) Verification of lawful presence in the United States
4 pursuant to section 4-108 requires that the applicant for public benefits
5 attest in a format prescribed by the Department of Administrative
6 Services that:

7 (a 1) He or she is a United States citizen; or

8 (b 2) He or she is a qualified alien under the federal Immigration
9 and Nationality Act, 8 U.S.C. 1101 et seq., as such act existed on
10 January 1, 2009, and is lawfully present in the United States.

11 (2) A state agency or political subdivision of the State of Nebraska
12 may adopt and promulgate rules and regulations or procedures for the
13 electronic filing of the attestation required under subsection (1) of
14 this section if such attestation is substantially similar to the format
15 prescribed by the Department of Administrative Services.

16 (3)(a) The Legislature finds that it is in the best interest of the
17 State of Nebraska to make full use of the skills and talents in the state
18 by ensuring that a person who is work-authorized is able to obtain a
19 professional or commercial license and practice his or her profession.

20 (b) For purposes of a professional or commercial license, the
21 Legislature finds that a person not described in subdivision (1)(a) or
22 (1)(b) of this section who submits (i) an unexpired employment
23 authorization document issued by the United States Department of Homeland
24 Security, Form I-766, and (ii) documentation issued by the United States
25 Department of Homeland Security, the United States Citizenship and
26 Immigration Services, or any other federal agency, such as one of the
27 types of Form I-797 used by the United States Citizenship and Immigration
28 Services, demonstrating that such person is described in section 202(c)
29 (2)(B)(i) through (ix) of the federal REAL ID Act of 2005, Public Law
30 109-13, has demonstrated lawful presence pursuant to section 4-108 and is
31 eligible to obtain such license. Such license shall be valid only for the

1 period of time during which such person's employment authorization
2 document is valid. Nothing in this subsection shall affect the
3 requirements to obtain a professional or commercial license that are
4 unrelated to the lawful presence requirements demonstrated pursuant to
5 this subsection.

6 (c) Nothing in this subsection shall be construed to grant
7 eligibility for any public benefits other than obtaining a professional
8 or commercial license.

9 (d) Any person who has complied with the requirements of this
10 subsection shall have his or her employment authorization document
11 verified through the Systematic Alien Verification for Entitlements
12 Program operated by the United States Department of Homeland Security or
13 an equivalent program designated by the United States Department of
14 Homeland Security.

15 (e) The Legislature enacts this subsection pursuant to the authority
16 provided in 8 U.S.C. 1621(d), as such section existed on January 1, 2016.

17 Sec. 2. Section 4-112, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
18 amended to read:

19 4-112 For any applicant who has executed a document described in
20 subdivision (1)(b) ~~(2)~~ of section 4-111, eligibility for public benefits
21 shall be verified through the Systematic Alien Verification for
22 Entitlements Program operated by the United States Department of Homeland
23 Security or an equivalent program designated by the United States
24 Department of Homeland Security. Until such verification of eligibility
25 is made, such attestation may be presumed to be proof of lawful presence
26 for purposes of sections 4-108 to 4-113 unless such verification is
27 required before providing the public benefit under another provision of
28 state or federal law.

29 Sec. 3. Section 38-129, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
30 2014, is amended to read:

31 38-129 (1) No individual shall be issued a credential under the

1 Uniform Credentialing Act until he or she has furnished satisfactory
2 evidence to the department that he or she is of good character and has
3 attained the age of nineteen years except as otherwise specifically
4 provided by statute, rule, or regulation.

5 (2) A credential may only be issued to (a) a citizen of the United
6 States, (b) an alien lawfully admitted into the United States who is
7 eligible for a credential under the Uniform Credentialing Act, (c) ~~or~~ a
8 nonimmigrant lawfully present in the United States who is eligible for a
9 credential under the Uniform Credentialing Act, or (d) a person who
10 submits (i) an unexpired employment authorization document issued by the
11 United States Department of Homeland Security, Form I-766, and (ii)
12 documentation issued by the United States Department of Homeland
13 Security, the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services, or any
14 other federal agency, such as one of the types of Form I-797 used by the
15 United States Citizenship and Immigration Services, demonstrating that
16 such person is described in section 202(c)(2)(B)(i) through (ix) of the
17 federal REAL ID Act of 2005, Public Law 109-13. Such credential shall be
18 valid only for the period of time during which such person's employment
19 authorization document is valid.

20 Sec. 4. Original sections 4-111 and 4-112, Reissue Revised Statutes
21 of Nebraska, and section 38-129, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
22 2014, are repealed.

23 Sec. 5. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect when
24 passed and approved according to law.
