1 Section 1. Section 68-158, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,

- 3 68-158 The Department of Health and Human Services shall establish a program to provide amino acid-based elemental formulas for the diagnosis 4 and treatment of Immunoglobulin E and non-Immunoglobulin E mediated 5 allergies to multiple food proteins, food-protein-induced enterocolitis 6 syndrome, eosinophilic disorders, and impaired absorption of nutrients 7 8 caused by disorders affecting the absorptive surface, functional length, 9 and motility of the gastrointestinal tract, when the ordering physician has issued a written order stating that the amino acid-based elemental 10 formula is medically necessary for the treatment of a disease or 11 disorder. Up to fifty percent of the actual out-of-pocket cost, not to 12 exceed twelve thousand dollars, for amino acid-based elemental formulas 13 14 shall be available to an individual without fees each twelve-month period. The department shall distribute funds on a first-come, first-15 16 served basis. Nothing in this section is deemed to be an entitlement. The maximum total General Fund expenditures per year for amino acid-based 17 elemental formulas shall not exceed two hundred fifty thousand dollars in 18 each fiscal year in FY2014-15 and FY2015-16. The Department of Health and 19 Human Services shall provide an electronic report on the program to the 20
