- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to education; to amend sections 79-238,
  2 79-2,125, 79-2,126, 79-2,127, 79-2,127.01, and 79-2,134, Reissue
- 2 79-2,125, 79-2,126, 79-2,127, 79-2,127.01, and 79-2,134, Reissue
- 3 Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to provide and change provisions
- 4 relating to student transportation costs, the option enrollment
- 5 program, and student fee authorization; to provide for loss of
- 6 accreditation as prescribed; to harmonize provisions; and to repeal
- 7 the original sections.
- 8 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 79-238, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is 2 amended to read:

3 79-238 (1) Except as provided in this section or section 79-240, the school board of the option school district shall adopt by resolution 4 5 specific standards for acceptance and rejection of applications. Standards may include the capacity of a program, class, grade level, or 6 7 school building or the availability of appropriate special education programs operated by the option school district. Except as otherwise 8 provided in this section, capacity Capacity shall be determined by 9 setting a maximum number of option students that a district will accept 10 in any program, class, grade level, or school building, based upon 11 available staff, facilities, projected enrollment of resident students, 12 13 and the projected number of students with which the option school 14 district will contract based on existing contractual arrangements, and availability of appropriate special education programs. The capacity of 15 16 special education programs and services may only be included in the standards if the capacity is set such that it is not reached until the 17 addition of a student, whether a new resident student or a new option 18 student, would cause the allowable excess cost per student for the 19 program or service to increase by more than fifteen percent. The school 20 board of the option school district may by resolution consistent with the 21 standards declare a program, a class, or a school unavailable to option 22 23 students due to lack of capacity. Standards shall not include previous academic achievement, athletic or 24 other extracurricular ability, 25 disabilities, proficiency in the English language, or previous disciplinary proceedings except as provided in section 79-266.01. False 26 or substantively misleading information submitted by a parent or guardian 27 on an application to an option school district may be cause for the 28 option school district to reject a previously accepted application if the 29 rejection occurs prior to the student's attendance as an option student. 30

(2) The school board of every school district shall also adopt

- 1 standards and conditions for acceptance or rejection of a request for
- 2 release of a resident student submitting an application to an option
- 3 school district after March 15 under subsection (1) of section 79-237.
- 4 (3) Any option school district shall give first priority for
- 5 enrollment to siblings of option students, except that the option school
- 6 district shall not be required to accept the sibling of an option student
- 7 if the district is at capacity except as provided in subsection (1) of
- 8 section 79-240.
- 9 (4) Any option school district that is in a learning community shall
- 10 give second priority for enrollment to students who reside in the
- 11 learning community and who contribute to the socioeconomic diversity of
- 12 enrollment as defined in section 79-2110 at the school building to which
- 13 the student will be assigned pursuant to section 79-235.
- 14 Sec. 2. Section 79-2,125, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 15 amended to read:
- 16 79-2,125 Sections 79-2,125 to 79-2,135 <u>and section 4 of this act</u>
- 17 shall be known and may be cited as the Public Elementary and Secondary
- 18 Student Fee Authorization Act.
- 19 Sec. 3. Section 79-2,126, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 20 amended to read:
- 21 79-2,126 For purposes of the Public Elementary and Secondary Student
- 22 Fee Authorization Act:
- 23 (1) Extracurricular activities means student activities or
- 24 organizations which are supervised or administered by the school
- 25 district, which do not count toward graduation or advancement between
- 26 grades, and in which participation is not otherwise required by the
- 27 school district;
- 28 (2) Governing body means a school board, a board of education, of
- 29 any class of school district or an educational service unit board; and
- 30 (3) Postsecondary education costs means tuition and other fees
- 31 associated with obtaining credit from a postsecondary educational

- 1 institution. For a course in which students receive high school credit
- 2 and for which they may also choose to apply for postsecondary education
- 3 credit, the course shall be offered without charge for tuition,
- 4 transportation, books, or other fees, except that if the student chooses
- 5 to apply for postsecondary education credit, he or she may be charged
- 6 tuition and other fees only associated with obtaining credits from a
- 7 postsecondary educational institution.
- 8 Sec. 4. <u>The Public Elementary and Secondary Student Fee</u>
- 9 Authorization Act shall be strictly interpreted and construed so as to
- 10 <u>minimize student fees and to maximize equitable access to the free</u>
- 11 <u>instruction required by Article VII, section 1, of the Constitution of</u>
- 12 Nebraska.
- Sec. 5. Section 79-2,127, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 14 amended to read:
- 15 79-2,127 Except as provided in section 79-2,133, a governing body
- 16 may require and collect fees or other funds from or on behalf of students
- 17 or require students to provide specialized equipment or specialized
- 18 attire for <del>any of</del> the following purposes:
- 19 (1) Participation in extracurricular activities;
- 20 (2) Admission fees and transportation charges for spectators
- 21 attending extracurricular activities;
- 22 (3) Postsecondary education costs;
- 23 (4) Transportation pursuant to sections 79-241, 79-605, and 79-611;
- 24 (5) Copies of student files or records pursuant to section 79-2,104;
- 25 (6) Reimbursement to the school district or educational service unit
- 26 for school district or educational service unit property lost or damaged
- 27 by the student;
- 28 (7) Before-and-after-school or prekindergarten services offered
- 29 pursuant to section 79-1104;
- 30 (8) Summer school or night school;
- 31 (9) Parking; and

- 1 (10) Breakfast and lunch programs.
- 2 Except as <u>specifically</u> provided in this section and sections
- 3 79-2,127.01, 79-2,131, and 79-2,132, a governing body shall not collect
- 4 money pursuant to the Public Elementary and Secondary Student Fee
- 5 Authorization Act from students.
- 6 Sec. 6. Section 79-2,127.01, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska,
- 7 is amended to read:
- 8 79-2,127.01 The Public Elementary and Secondary Student Fee
- 9 Authorization Act does not limit the ability of a governing body to
- 10 accept voluntary request donations of money, materials, equipment, or
- 11 attire. Individual teachers and principals are authorized to request
- 12 <u>voluntary donations of money, materials, equipment, or attire to enhance</u>
- 13 unique educational opportunities for their students if such request
- 14 complies with the school district policy adopted pursuant to the act and
- 15 the request is made in such a way that it is clear that the request is
- 16 not a requirement and shall not affect a student's grade to defray costs
- 17 if the request is made in such a way that it is clear that the request is
- 18 not a requirement. The act does not prohibit a governing body from
- 19 permitting students to supply materials for course projects.
- 20 Sec. 7. Section 79-2,134, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 21 amended to read:
- 22 79-2,134 On or before August 1, 2002, and annually each year
- 23 thereafter, each school board and board of education shall hold a public
- 24 hearing at a regular or special meeting of the board on a proposed
- 25 student fee policy, following a review of the amount of money collected
- 26 from students pursuant to, and the use of waivers provided in, the
- 27 student fee policy for the prior school year. The student fee policy
- 28 shall be adopted by a majority vote of the school board and shall be
- 29 published in the student handbook. The adopted policy shall also be
- 30 <u>submitted annually to the State Department of Education in a manner</u>
- 31 prescribed by the department. The board shall annually provide a copy of

- 1 the student handbook to every student, or to every household in which at
- 2 least one student resides, at no cost to the student or household. The
- 3 student fee policy shall include specific details regarding:
- 4 (1) The general written guidelines for any nonspecialized attire
- 5 required for specified courses and activities;
- 6 (2) Any personal or consumable items a student will be required to
- 7 furnish for participation in extracurricular activities;
- 8 (3) Any specialized equipment or attire which a student will be
- 9 required to provide for any extracurricular activity;
- 10 (4) Any fees required from a student for participation in any
- 11 extracurricular activity;
- 12 (5) Any fees required for postsecondary education costs;
- 13 (6) Any fees required for transportation costs pursuant to sections
- 14 79-241, 79-605, and 79-611;
- 15 (7) Any fees required for copies of student files or records
- 16 pursuant to section 79-2,104;
- 17 (8) Any fees required for participation in before-and-after-school
- 18 or prekindergarten services offered pursuant to section 79-1104;
- 19 (9) Any fees required for participation in summer school or night
- 20 school;
- 21 (10) Any fees for breakfast and lunch programs;—and
- 22 (11) The waiver policy pursuant to section 79-2,133; and -
- 23 (12) Requests for donations of money, materials, equipment, or
- 24 attire.
- 25 No fee, specialized equipment or attire, or nonspecialized attire
- 26 may be required pursuant to the Public Elementary and Secondary Student
- 27 Fee Authorization Act unless the maximum dollar amount of the fee, the
- 28 specifications for the specialized equipment or attire, or the
- 29 specifications for the nonspecialized attire are specified in the student
- 30 fee policy approved by the board. Reimbursement pursuant to subdivision
- 31 (6) of section 79-2,127 for property lost or damaged by a student may be

- 1 required without specification in the student fee policy.
- 2 A school district with a school board or board of education which
- 3 <u>fails to annually approve</u>, or fails to annually submit in a manner
- 4 prescribed by the State Department of Education, a student fee policy
- 5 complying with the Public Elementary and Secondary Student Fee
- 6 Authorization Act shall lose its accreditation status.
