- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to education; to create the Nebraska Council
- 2 for Educational Success; and to provide powers and duties.
- 3 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1	Section 1. The Nebraska Council for Educational Success is created.
2	The council shall consist of:
3	<u>(1) The Governor or his or her designee;</u>
4	(2) The Commissioner of Education who shall be co-chairperson of the
5	<pre>council;</pre>
6	(3) The executive director of the Coordinating Commission for
7	Postsecondary Education who shall be co-chairperson of the council;
8	(4) The chancellor of the Nebraska State College System;
9	<u>(5) The executive director of the Nebraska Community College</u>
10	<u>Association;</u>
11	<u>(6) The director of the Educational Service Unit Coordinating</u>
12	<u>Council;</u>
13	(7) The Director of Economic Development;
14	<u>(8) The Commissioner of Labor;</u>
15	<u>(9) The chief executive officer of the Department of Health and</u>
16	<u>Human Services;</u>
17	(10) The executive director of the Buffett Early Childhood Institute
18	<u>at the University of Nebraska;</u>
19	(11) The president of the University of Nebraska System;
20	(12) The following members appointed by the Governor:
21	<u>(a) An individual from an association that represents private</u>
22	<u>colleges and universities;</u>
23	<u>(b) An individual representing an educational foundation operating</u>
24	<u>within Nebraska;</u>
25	<u>(c) A parent of a child in any of grades kindergarten through</u>
26	<u>twelve;</u>
27	<u>(d) An individual representing an organization that represents</u>
28	<u>business interests in Nebraska;</u>
29	<u>(e) An administrator employed by a school district;</u>
30	(f) A member of a school board; and
31	<u>(g) A teacher employed by a school district.</u>

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1	(13) The following nonvoting members:
2	<u>(a) The chairperson of the Education Committee of the Legislature;</u>
3	(b) The chairperson of the Appropriations Committee of the
4	Legislature; and
5	(c) The chairperson of the Revenue Committee of the Legislature.
6	Members appointed pursuant to subdivision (13) of this section shall
7	serve for terms of three years each, may be reappointed, and shall be
8	reimbursed for their actual and necessary expenses as members of the
9	council as provided in sections 81-1174 to 81-1177.
10	Sec. 2. <u>The purposes of the Nebraska Council for Educational</u>
11	Success are to (1) facilitate and strengthen collaboration of publicly
12	funded programs from early childhood through postsecondary education, (2)
13	identify a process for measuring the progress of implementation of the
14	strategic plan to create the statewide vision for education pursuant to
15	section 50-427, and (3) make recommendations designed for a more
16	coordinated, integrated, seamless education system that enables children
17	to enter school ready to learn, receive challenging instruction
18	throughout their school careers, graduate from high school ready for
19	postsecondary education and careers, and continue their education through
20	postsecondary study in ways that make them productive in the workforce
21	and successful citizens.
22	Sec. 3. (1) The Nebraska Council for Educational Success shall meet
23	at least once each calendar quarter and as frequently as necessary to
24	afford the general public, representatives of governmental agencies, and
25	representatives of private and nongovernmental organizations an
26	opportunity to present information and recommendations relating to
27	coordination between elementary, secondary, and postsecondary education.
28	The council shall cause a record to be kept of all its proceedings,
29	including, but not limited to, minutes of all meetings of the council.

30 <u>Meetings of the council shall be subject to the Open Meetings Act. All</u>

31 <u>records and documents of the council shall be considered public records</u>

1	for the purposes of sections 84-712 to 84-712.09.
2	(2) The council shall provide an annual report to the Governor and
3	the Legislature, summarizing the activities of the council for the
4	preceding year. The report to the Legislature shall be submitted
5	<u>electronically.</u>
6	Sec. 4. The State Department of Education, with the support of the
7	Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary Education shall provide the
8	Nebraska Council for Educational Success with administrative support,
9	equipment, a web site showing the activities undertaken and measures
10	accomplished by the council, and office space. Upon request by the
11	<u>council, the Board of Regents of the University of Nebraska, the Nebraska</u>
12	State College System, the community colleges, and any state agency shall
13	<u>provide campus, technical, or statewide data, respectively, unless</u>
14	disclosure of such information is prohibited by federal or state law.
15	Sec. 5. (1) The Nebraska Council for Educational Success shall make
16	recommendations to the Legislature or the appropriate educational
17	governing board for research-based ideas, including, but not limited to,
18	<u>ideas to:</u>
19	<u>(a) Strengthen mechanisms to increase the number and academic</u>
20	quality of students who enroll in teacher education programs offered by
21	<u>Nebraska colleges and universities, including, but not limited to,</u>
22	financial aid programs for students enrolled in such programs, with an
23	emphasis on increasing the number of students to teach in identified or
24	expected shortage area as defined in section 79-8,133;
25	<u>(b) Strengthen mechanisms to ensure the successful transition of</u>
26	children from early childhood education programs to elementary school,
27	from elementary school to middle school, middle school to high school,
28	and high school to postsecondary education or the workforce, or both;
29	<u>(c) Strengthen mechanisms to increase constructive parental</u>
30	involvement that improves the educational outcomes for their children;

31 (d) Strengthen mechanisms to ensure that the coursework, standards,

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LB371 2015 and assessments required of pupils in secondary schools are aligned with 1 2 the knowledge and workload expected of students at the postsecondary 3 level; (e) Strengthen mechanisms to ensure collaboration among the business 4 community, members of the academic community, and political leaders to 5 develop strategies for the growth and diversification of the economy of 6 7 this state; (f) Strengthen policies relating to workforce development, 8 9 employment needs of private employers, and workforce shortages in 10 occupations critical to the education, health, and safety of the residents of Nebraska; 11 (g) Strengthen the development or identification of a statewide 12 longitudinal data system that links data relating to early childhood 13 education programs and public education in grades kindergarten through 14 15 twelve with data relating to postsecondary education and the workforce in Nebraska; 16 17 (h) Facilitate development of a plan for collaborative research 18 using data from the statewide longitudinal data system developed pursuant to subdivision (1)(g) of this section, including, but not limited to, 19 20 research that assesses: (i) The efficiency and effectiveness of the use of state resources 21 22 to improve the readiness of students for postsecondary education and the 23 workforce; 24 (ii) The effectiveness of the preparation of teachers and 25 administrators; (iii) The return on investment of educational and workforce 26 development programs paid for with public funds; and 27

28 (iv) The efficiency and effectiveness of the use of resources in postsecondary education, including, but not limited to, operating 29 appropriations to the postsecondary educational institutions and 30 financial aid programs; 31

1	<u>(i) Create a process for measuring the progress of implementation of</u>
2	the strategic plan to create the statewide vision for education pursuant
3	to section 50-427 and include in the annual report required under section
4	<u>3 of this act the progress of such implementation using the measuring</u>
5	process created under this section;
6	<u>(j) Recommend to the Education Committee of the Legislature the need</u>
7	for any statutory changes that the council considers necessary to meet
8	the goals established under the strategic plan; and
9	<u>(k) Address other matters as determined necessary or appropriate by</u>
10	the council.
11	(2) The council may establish committees and may apply for any
12	available grants and accept any gifts, grants, and donations from any
13	source to assist the council in carrying out its duties.
