- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to the Nebraska Rules of the Road; to amend
- 2 sections 60-4,182 and 60-601, Revised Statutes Cumulative
- 3 Supplement, 2014; to prohibit use of an interactive wireless
- 4 communication device while operating a motor vehicle as prescribed;
- to harmonize provisions; and to repeal the original sections.
- 6 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. Section 60-4,182, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 2 2014, is amended to read:
- 3 60-4,182 In order to prevent and eliminate successive traffic
- 4 violations, there is hereby provided a point system dealing with traffic
- 5 violations as disclosed by the files of the director. The following point
- 6 system shall be adopted:
- 7 (1) Conviction of motor vehicle homicide 12 points;
- 8 (2) Third offense drunken driving in violation of any city or
- 9 village ordinance or of section 60-6,196, as disclosed by the records of
- 10 the director, regardless of whether the trial court found the same to be
- 11 a third offense 12 points;
- 12 (3) Failure to stop and render aid as required under section 60-697
- 13 in the event of involvement in a motor vehicle accident resulting in the
- 14 death or personal injury of another 6 points;
- 15 (4) Failure to stop and report as required under section 60-696 or
- 16 any city or village ordinance in the event of a motor vehicle accident
- 17 resulting in property damage 6 points;
- 18 (5) Driving a motor vehicle while under the influence of alcoholic
- 19 liquor or any drug or when such person has a concentration of eight-
- 20 hundredths of one gram or more by weight of alcohol per one hundred
- 21 milliliters of his or her blood or per two hundred ten liters of his or
- 22 her breath in violation of any city or village ordinance or of section
- 23 60-6,196 6 points;
- 24 (6) Willful reckless driving in violation of any city or village
- 25 ordinance or of section 60-6,214 or 60-6,217 6 points;
- 26 (7) Careless driving in violation of any city or village ordinance
- 27 or of section 60-6,212 4 points;
- 28 (8) Negligent driving in violation of any city or village ordinance
- 29 3 points;
- 30 (9) Reckless driving in violation of any city or village ordinance
- 31 or of section 60-6,213 5 points;

- 1 (10) Speeding in violation of any city or village ordinance or any
- 2 of sections 60-6,185 to 60-6,190 and 60-6,313:
- 3 (a) Not more than five miles per hour over the speed limit 1
- 4 point;
- 5 (b) More than five miles per hour but not more than ten miles per
- 6 hour over the speed limit 2 points;
- 7 (c) More than ten miles per hour but not more than thirty-five miles
- 8 per hour over the speed limit 3 points, except that one point shall be
- 9 assessed upon conviction of exceeding by not more than ten miles per
- 10 hour, two points shall be assessed upon conviction of exceeding by more
- 11 than ten miles per hour but not more than fifteen miles per hour, and
- 12 three points shall be assessed upon conviction of exceeding by more than
- 13 fifteen miles per hour but not more than thirty-five miles per hour the
- 14 speed limits provided for in subdivision (1)(e), (f), (g), or (h) of
- 15 section 60-6,186; and
- 16 (d) More than thirty-five miles per hour over the speed limit 4
- 17 points;
- 18 (11) Failure to yield to a pedestrian not resulting in bodily injury
- 19 to a pedestrian 2 points;
- 20 (12) Failure to yield to a pedestrian resulting in bodily injury to
- 21 a pedestrian 4 points;
- 22 (13) Using a handheld wireless communication device in violation of
- 23 section 60-6,179.01 or texting while driving in violation of subsection
- 24 (1) or (3) of section 60-6,179.02 3 points;
- 25 (14) Using a handheld mobile telephone in violation of subsection
- 26 (2) or (4) of section 60-6,179.02 3 points;
- 27 (15) Using an interactive wireless communication device in violation
- 28 of section 3 of this act 3 points;
- 29 $(\underline{16} \ \underline{45})$ Unlawful obstruction or interference of the view of an
- 30 operator in violation of section 60-6,256 1 point;
- 31 $(\underline{17} \ \underline{16})$ A violation of subsection (1) of section 60-6,175 3

- 1 points; and
- 2 $(18 ext{17})$ All other traffic violations involving the operation of
- 3 motor vehicles by the operator for which reports to the Department of
- 4 Motor Vehicles are required under sections 60-497.01 and 60-497.02 1
- 5 point.
- 6 Subdivision (18 17) of this section does not include violations
- 7 involving an occupant protection system pursuant to section 60-6,270,
- 8 parking violations, violations for operating a motor vehicle without a
- 9 valid operator's license in the operator's possession, muffler
- 10 violations, overwidth, overheight, or overlength violations, motorcycle
- or moped protective helmet violations, or overloading of trucks.
- 12 All such points shall be assessed against the driving record of the
- 13 operator as of the date of the violation for which conviction was had.
- 14 Points may be reduced by the department under section 60-4,188.
- In all cases, the forfeiture of bail not vacated shall be regarded
- 16 as equivalent to the conviction of the offense with which the operator
- 17 was charged.
- 18 The point system shall not apply to persons convicted of traffic
- 19 violations committed while operating a bicycle or an electric personal
- 20 assistive mobility device as defined in section 60-618.02.
- 21 Sec. 2. Section 60-601, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
- 22 2014, is amended to read:
- 23 60-601 Sections 60-601 to 60-6,382 <u>and section 3 of this act</u>shall
- 24 be known and may be cited as the Nebraska Rules of the Road.
- 25 Sec. 3. (1) For purposes of this section interactive wireless
- 26 <u>communication device has the definition found in section 60-470.02.</u>
- 27 (2) Except as otherwise provided in sections 60-6,179.01 and
- 28 <u>60-6,179.02, no person shall operate a motor vehicle on any highway (a)</u>
- 29 while holding an interactive wireless communication device to or in the
- 30 immediate proximity of his or her ear in order to talk into the device or
- 31 listen to a voice or digital communication or (b) while holding an

- 1 interactive wireless communication device to view, record, or transmit
- 2 <u>images or text, play games, or otherwise access any data for any purpose.</u>
- 3 <u>(3) This section does not apply to:</u>
- 4 (a) The use of an interactive wireless communication device for the
- 5 sole purpose of communicating with any of the following regarding an
- 6 emergency situation: An emergency response operator; a physician; an
- 7 emergency medical service; a fire department; or a law enforcement
- 8 <u>agency;</u>
- 9 (b) Any of the following persons while in the performance of their
- 10 official duties: Law enforcement personnel; a member of a fire
- 11 <u>department; or the operator of an emergency vehicle; or</u>
- 12 (c) A person while the motor vehicle is stopped at the side of or
- 13 off a highway in a location where such vehicle is not otherwise
- 14 prohibited from stopping by law or by any lawful order of law enforcement
- 15 personnel.
