- 1 Section 1. Section 24-201.01, Revised Statutes Cumulative
- 2 Supplement, 2014, is amended to read:
- 3 24-201.01 On July 1, 2012, the salary of the Chief Justice and the
- 4 judges of the Supreme Court shall be one hundred forty-five thousand six
- 5 hundred fourteen dollars and seventy-four cents. On July 1, 2013, the
- 6 salary of the Chief Justice and the judges of the Supreme Court shall be
- 7 one hundred fifty-two thousand eight hundred ninety-five dollars and
- 8 forty-eight cents. On July 1, 2014, the salary of the Chief Justice and
- 9 the judges of the Supreme Court shall be one hundred sixty thousand five
- 10 hundred forty dollars and twenty-five cents. On July 1, 2015, the salary
- 11 of the Chief Justice and the judges of the Supreme Court shall be one
- 12 <u>hundred sixty-four thousand one hundred fifty-two dollars and forty-one</u>
- 13 cents. On July 1, 2016, the salary of the Chief Justice and the judges of
- 14 the Supreme Court shall be one hundred sixty-eight thousand ninety-two
- 15 dollars and six cents.
- 16 The Chief Justice and the judges of the Supreme Court shall hold no
- 17 other public office of profit or trust during their terms of office nor
- 18 accept any public appointment or employment under the authority of the
- 19 government of the United States for which they receive compensation for
- 20 their services. Such salaries shall be payable in equal monthly
- 21 installments.
- 22 Sec. 2. This act becomes operative on July 1, 2015.
- 23 Sec. 3. Original section 24-201.01, Revised Statutes Cumulative
- 24 Supplement, 2014, is repealed.
- 25 Sec. 4. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect when
- 26 passed and approved according to law.
