- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to witnesses; to require law enforcement
- 2 agencies to adopt a policy on suspect identification by witnesses as
- 3 prescribed.
- 4 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- Section 1. (1) On or before January 1, 2017, the Nebraska State
- 2 Patrol, the county sheriffs, all city and village police departments, and
- 3 any other law enforcement agency of this state or of any political
- 4 subdivision of this state shall adopt a written policy on suspect
- 5 <u>identification</u> by witnesses and provide a copy of such policy to the
- 6 Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice.
- 7 (2) The policy required by this section shall, at a minimum, include
- 8 the following best practices recommended by the National Research
- 9 <u>Council</u>, the International Association of Chiefs of Police, and the
- 10 American Bar Association:
- 11 (a) Blind or blinded administration of the lineup, in which the
- 12 officer conducting the lineup is unaware of the suspect's identity, or if
- 13 that is not practical, the officer uses a blinded procedure that prevents
- 14 <u>him or her from seeing which photograph is being viewed by the witness at</u>
- 15 a given time;
- 16 (b) Instructions to the eyewitness, including that the perpetrator
- 17 may or may not be among the persons in the identification procedures;
- 18 <u>(c) Use of non-suspect fillers that do not make the suspect</u>
- 19 <u>noticeably stand out and generally match the witness's description of the</u>
- 20 <u>perpetrator; and</u>
- 21 (d) If the witness makes an identification, the officer shall elicit
- 22 and document the witness's level of certainty, in his or her own words,
- 23 <u>immediately after the identification is made.</u>
- 24 (3) The Nebraska Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice
- 25 shall develop and distribute a suggested model written policy on suspect
- 26 identification by witnesses that includes the best practices described in
- 27 <u>subsection (2) of this section. The commission shall not require any law</u>
- 28 enforcement agency to adopt the model policy except for any law
- 29 <u>enforcement agency which fails to create its own policy under subsection</u>
- (1) of this section.
