- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to education; to state intent; and to provide
- for successful completion of a civics test as a prerequisite to high
- 3 school graduation as prescribed.
- 4 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

- 1 Section 1. It is the intent of the Legislature that the civics
- 2 portion of the naturalization test used by the United States Bureau of
- 3 Citizenship and Immigration Services be available to every student in a
- 4 Nebraska high school in order that the students demonstrate a knowledge
- 5 <u>and understanding of the fundamentals of United States history and the</u>
- 6 principles of United States government.
- 7 Sec. 2. (1) For purposes of this section, civics test means the one
- 8 <u>hundred questions listed on a test that is identical to the civics</u>
- 9 portion of the naturalization test used by the United States Bureau of
- 10 <u>Citizenship and Immigration Services, as required by 8 U.S.C. 1423, as</u>
- 11 <u>such section existed on January 1, 2016.</u>
- 12 (2) Beginning in school year 2017, as provided in subsection (3) of
- 13 this section, each high school student shall correctly answer at least
- 14 seventy percent of the questions on the civics test as a prerequisite to
- 15 graduation.
- 16 (3) Each school district may determine the method and manner in
- 17 which to administer the civics test to each student. A student may take
- 18 the test, in whole or in part, at any time after enrolling in grade nine
- 19 and may repeat the test, or any portion thereof, as often as necessary to
- 20 achieve the score required under subsection (2) of this section. A
- 21 student may be exempted from the requirement of this section by the
- 22 provisions of the student's individualized education plan.
- 23 (4) A school district may not impose or collect any fees or charges
- 24 <u>in connection with this section.</u>
- 25 (5) This section is applicable to any student who graduates from
- 26 <u>high school during or after the 2017-18 school year.</u>
