1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to parenting; to amend section 20-170, Reissue

2 Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to state findings; to provide duties

3 for school districts and the State Department of Education relating

4 to policies for pregnant and parenting students; to provide for

5 training; to change provisions relating to the right to breast-feed

as prescribed; and to repeal the original section.

7 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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- 1 Section 1. The Legislature finds and declares that:
- 2 (1) Pregnant and parenting students face enormous challenges to
- 3 completing their education. The majority of young women who become
- 4 pregnant in high school leave school which detrimentally impacts their
- 5 financial, social, and educational future, as well as the future of their
- 6 children;
- 7 (2) Schools have an obligation to keep pregnant and parenting
- 8 <u>students in school;</u>
- 9 (3) Schools must remove overly restrictive or inflexible absence and
- 10 leave policies so that pregnant students can attend prenatal medical
- 11 appointments and parenting students can attend appointments for pediatric
- 12 <u>medical care, provide opportunities for students to make up school work</u>
- 13 or allow alternative education for students who become pregnant, and make
- 14 accommodations for breastfeeding or milk expression; and
- 15 (4) Young women should not have to choose between completing their
- 16 education and parenthood.
- 17 Sec. 2. <u>Beginning May 1, 2018, the school board of each school</u>
- 18 district shall adopt a written policy to be implemented at the start of
- 19 <u>the 2018-19 school year which provides for standards and guidelines to</u>
- 20 accommodate absences related to pregnancy and child care for pregnant and
- 21 parenting students. Such policy shall include procedures and provisions
- 22 in conformance with the minimum standards set forth in any model policy
- 23 developed by the State Department of Education pursuant to section 3 of
- 24 this act or shall meet the minimum standards set forth in such section
- 25 and may include any other procedures and provisions the school board
- 26 deems appropriate.
- 27 Sec. 3. On or before December 1, 2017, the State Department of
- 28 Education may develop and distribute a model policy to encourage the
- 29 educational success of pregnant and parenting students. At a minimum,
- 30 such policy shall:
- 31 (1) Specifically identify procedures to anticipate and provide for

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1 student absences due to pregnancy and allow students to return to school

- 2 and, if applicable, participate in extracurricular activities after
- 3 <u>pregnancy;</u>
- 4 (2) Provide alternative methods to keep a pregnant or parenting
- 5 student in school by allowing coursework to be accessed at home or
- 6 accommodating tutoring visits, online courses, or a similar supplement to
- 7 classroom attendance;
- 8 (3) Identify alternatives for accommodating lactation by providing
- 9 students with private, hygienic spaces to express breast milk during the
- 10 school day; and
- 11 (4) Establish a procedure for schools which do not have an in-school
- 12 child care facility to assist student-parents by identifying child care
- 13 providers for purposes of placing their children in child care facilities
- 14 which, where possible, participate in the quality rating and improvement
- 15 system and meet all of the quality rating criteria for at least a step-
- 16 three rating pursuant to the Step Up to Quality Child Care Act and which
- 17 collaborate with the school.
- 18 Sec. 4. In addition to the development of a model policy, the State
- 19 Department of Education may offer training for teachers, counselors, and
- 20 <u>administrators on each school district's policy adopted under section 2</u>
- 21 of this act and the rights of pregnant and parenting students to receive
- 22 equal access to education.
- 23 Sec. 5. Section 20-170, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
- 24 amended to read:
- 25 20-170 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a mother may
- 26 breast-feed her child in any public or private location where the mother
- 27 is otherwise authorized to be, including, but not limited to, a mother
- 28 who is attending a public, private, denominational, or parochial day
- 29 school which meets the requirements for legal operation prescribed in
- 30 Chapter 79. For a mother who is attending a public, private,
- 31 denominational, or parochial day school which meets the requirement for

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- 1 <u>legal operation prescribed in Chapter 79, the school shall also provide</u>
- 2 <u>for private or appropriate facilities or accommodation for milk</u>
- 3 expression and storage. Nothing in this section limits the authority of
- 4 administrative and teaching personnel to regulate student behavior as
- 5 provided by section 79-258 or the authority of a private, denominational,
- 6 or parochial school to regulate student behavior in order to further
- 7 school purposes or to prevent interference with the educational process.
- 8 Sec. 6. Original section 20-170, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 9 Nebraska, is repealed.
