- 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT relating to developmental disabilities; to amend 2 section 83-1216, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and sections 3 71-1101, 71-1107, and 71-1108.01, Revised Statutes Cumulative 4 Supplement, 2016; to define and redefine terms and eliminate 5 definitions; to change and eliminate provisions relating to 6 legislative intent; to harmonize provisions; to repeal the original 7 sections; to outright repeal section 71-1113, Reissue Revised 8 Statutes of Nebraska; and to declare an emergency.

1 Section 1. Section 71-1101, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,

- 3 71-1101 Sections 71-1101 to 71-1134 and section 4 of this act shall
- 4 be known and may be cited as the Developmental Disabilities Court-Ordered

- 6 Sec. 2. Section 71-1107, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,

- 8 71-1107 Developmental disability means <u>a severe, chronic disability</u>,
- 9 including an intellectual disability, other than mental illness, which:
- 10 an intellectual disability or a severe chronic cognitive impairment,
- 11 other than mental illness, that is manifested before the age of twenty-
- 12 two years and is likely to continue indefinitely.
- 13 (1) Is attributable to a mental or physical impairment unless the
- 14 <u>impairment is solely attributable to a severe emotional disturbance or</u>
- 15 persistent mental illness;
- 16 (2) Is manifested before the age of twenty-two years;
- 17 (3) Is likely to continue indefinitely;
- 18 (4) Results in substantial functional limitations in one of each of
- 19 <u>the following areas of adaptive functioning:</u>
- 20 <u>(a) Conceptual skills, including language, literacy, money, time, </u>
- 21 <u>number concepts</u>, and self-direction;
- 22 (b) Social skills, including interpersonal skills, social
- 23 responsibility, self-esteem, gullibility, wariness, social problem
- 24 solving, and the ability to follow laws and rules and to avoid being
- 25 victimized; and
- 26 (c) Practical skills, including activities of daily living, personal
- 27 <u>care, occupational skills, healthcare, mobility, and the capacity for</u>
- 28 independent living; and
- 29 <u>(5) Reflects the individual's need for a combination and sequence of</u>
- 30 special, interdisciplinary, or generic services, individualized support,
- 31 or other forms of assistance that are of lifelong or extended duration

- 1 and are individually planned and coordinated.
- 2 <u>An individual from birth through the age of nine years who has a</u>
- 3 <u>substantial developmental delay or specific congenital or acquired</u>
- 4 condition may be considered to have a developmental disability without
- 5 <u>manifesting substantial functional limitations in three or more of the</u>
- 6 areas of adaptive functioning described in subdivision (4) of this
- 7 section if the individual, without services and support, has a high
- 8 probability of manifesting such limitations in such areas later in life.

- 11 71-1108.01 Intellectual disability means <del>a state of</del> significantly
- 12 subaverage general intellectual functioning which is associated with
- 13 significant impairments in adaptive functioning manifested before the age
- 14 of twenty-two years. Significant subaverage general intellectual
- 15 functioning shall refer to a score of seventy or below on a properly
- 16 administered and valid intelligence quotient test.

- 19 83-1216 (1) The department shall administer the medicaid home and
- 20 <u>community-based services waivers upon application approval by the federal</u>
- 21 <u>Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services</u> Beginning July 1, 1995,
- 22 persons determined to be eligible for specialized services who on or
- 23 after September 6, 1993, graduate from high school, reach the age of
- 24 twenty-one years, or are currently receiving services shall receive
- 25 services in accordance with the Developmental Disabilities Services Act.
- 26 The amount of funding for any person receiving services shall be
- 27 determined using an objective assessment process developed by the plan in
- 28 subsection (3) of this section.
- 29 (2) The department shall provide directly or by contract service
- 30 coordination to Nebraska residents found to be eligible for specialized
- 31 services.

- 1 (3) It is the intent of the Legislature that by July 1, 2010, all
- 2 persons determined to be eligible for services shall receive services in
- 3 accordance with the act.
- 4 (3) (4) It is the intent of the Legislature that the department take
- 5 all possible steps to maximize <u>federal</u> funding in order to implement
- 6 subsections (1) and (2) of this section prior to the date these
- 7 subsections become entitlements. All Nebraska residents eligible for
- 8 funding for specialized services through the Division of under the
- 9 Developmental Disabilities Services Act shall apply for and accept any
- 10 federal medicaid benefits for which they may be eligible and benefits
- 11 from other funding sources within the department, the State Department of
- 12 Education, specifically including the Division of Rehabilitation
- 13 Services, and other agencies to the maximum extent possible.
