1	Section 1. Section 60-601, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
2	2016, is amended to read:
3	60-601 Sections 60-601 to 60-6,383 <u>and section 2 of this act</u> shall
4	be known and may be cited as the Nebraska Rules of the Road.
5	Sec. 2. (1) The Department of Motor Vehicles shall include in the
6	Nebraska Driver's Manual at the next scheduled update of the manual the
7	following information:
8	TRAFFIC STOP SAFETY
9	<u>Traffic stops can be stressful, but responding in a calm manner can</u>
10	help to resolve the event as expediently as possible. Anytime a police
11	officer stops your vehicle, for the driver's safety and the safety of
12	others, it is recommended you do the following:
13	<u>(a) Signal your intention to turn or pull over and drive as close as</u>
14	safely possible to the right edge of the road, stop, and park your
15	vehicle safely away from oncoming traffic;
16	(b) Turn off your vehicle engine and radio. Roll down your window so
17	that you can communicate with the officer;
18	(c) If it is nighttime, turn on your vehicle's interior light as
19	soon as you stop and before the officer approaches;
20	(d) Limit movement in your vehicle. Do not reach for anything in
21	your vehicle until instructed to do so. This also applies to any
22	<u>passengers;</u>
23	<u>(e) If you are transporting any type of firearm, alert the officer</u>
24	immediately. The officer is allowed to ask for and hold the weapon for
25	the duration of the traffic stop;
26	(f) Place your hands open palm on the steering wheel and request
27	that your passengers also have their hands in view;
28	(g) Keep your vehicle doors closed as the officer approaches the
29	vehicle. Stay inside your vehicle, unless the officer requests you to get
30	<u>out;</u>
31	(h) Keep your seat belt fastened until the officer has viewed that

1 you are appropriately restrained; 2 (i) Wait until the officer requests that you retrieve your driver's license, registration, and insurance cards. Never hand the officer your 3 4 wallet. Once you have handed the officer the requested paperwork, return 5 your hands to the steering wheel and keep them visible; and 6 (j) Always be polite. The officer will explain to you why you have 7 been stopped. You may receive only a warning or you may be cited for a traffic violation. If you do not agree with the citation, you are 8 9 entitled to a court hearing where you can present your arguments. It is 10 never in your best interest to argue with the officer at the scene. If 11 you believe that you have not been treated in a professional manner or you feel uncomfortable with the nature of the traffic stop, you have the 12 13 right to request a supervisor to the scene. 14 (2) The department may make any additions, modifications, or deletions to such information as procedures change. 15 16 Original section 60-601, Revised Statutes Cumulative Sec. 3.
