The following constitutes the reasons for this bill and the purposes which are sought to be accomplished thereby:

LB 757 relates to consumer protection regulations and requires that individual or commercial entities in Nebraska that hold personal information must implement and maintain reasonable security procedures and practices. LB 757 further requires that if consumer reporting agencies provide personal information to a third party, that party also maintains reasonable security and procedures. The legislation assures that if a security breach occurs, the consumer reporting agency shall not charge any fee for placing, temporarily lifting or removing a security freeze. Lastly, the bill further strengthens the Attorney General's powers to enforce important consumer protections in cases of a data breach.
