Summary of purpose and/or changes:

The bill amends section 60-6,279 relating to mandatory motorcycle helmet usage. The section is amended by providing

that no motorcycle, moped, or autocycle shall be operated on the highways of Nebraska unless the operator is wearing eye protection (eye protection is defined as glasses that cover the orbital region of a person's face, or a protective face shield attached to a helmet, goggles, or a windshield that protects the operator's and passenger's horizontal line of vision in all operating positions).	
Any person 21 years of age or older is exempt from the requirements of the section that directs an approved, compliant motorcycle helmet shall be worn by any person operating or riding as a passenger on a motorcycle or moped on the highways of Nebraska.
