- 3 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. The Nebraska State Patrol shall conduct a study to 2 determine how to increase state criminal justice protective and 3 investigative resources for reporting and identifying missing Native 4 American women and children in Nebraska. The Nebraska State Patrol shall 5 work with the Commission on Indian Affairs to convene meetings with tribal and local law enforcement partners, federally recognized tribes, 6 7 and urban Indian organizations to determine the scope of the problem, identify barriers, and find ways to create partnerships to increase 8 9 reporting and investigation of missing Native American women and 10 children. Consultation and collaboration with federally recognized tribes shall be conducted with respect for government-to-government relations. 11 The Nebraska State Patrol shall work with the United States Department of 12 13 Justice to increase information sharing and resource coordination to 14 focus on reporting and investigating missing Native American women and 15 children in Nebraska. The Nebraska State Patrol shall submit a report 16 electronically to the Executive Board of the Legislative Council by June 17 1, 2020, on the results of such study. Such report shall include data and analysis of the number of missing Native American women and children in 18 19 Nebraska, identification of barriers in providing state resources to address the issue, and recommendations, including any proposed 20 legislation, to improve the reporting and identification of missing 21 22 Native American women and children in Nebraska.
