Section 1. Section 85-2002, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
 2018, is amended to read:

3 85-2002 For purposes of the Community College Gap Assistance Program4 Act:

5 (1) Committee means the Nebraska Community College Student
6 Performance and Occupational Education Grant Committee;

7 (2) Community college gap assistance program means the program8 created pursuant to section 85-2003;

9 (3) Eligible program means a program offered by a community college 10 that (a) either (i) is not offered for credit and has a duration of not less than sixteen contact hours in length or (ii) is offered for credit 11 but is of insufficient clock, semester, or quarter hours to be eligible 12 for Federal Pell Grants, (b) but is aligned with training programs with 13 stackable credentials that lead to a program awarding college credit, an 14 15 associate's degree, a diploma, or a certificate in an in-demand occupation, has a duration of not less than sixteen contact hours in 16 17 length, and (c) does any of the following:

(i) (a) Offers a state, national, or locally recognized certificate;
 (ii) (b) Offers preparation for a professional examination or
 licensure;

21 (<u>iii</u>) (c) Provides endorsement for an existing credential or 22 license;

23 (iv) (d) Represents recognized skill standards defined by an
 24 industrial sector; or

25 (v) (e) Offers a similar credential or training; and

26 (4) In-demand occupation means:

27 (a) Financial services;

28 (b) Transportation, warehousing, and distribution logistics;

29 (c) Precision metals manufacturing;

30 (d) Biosciences;

31 (e) Renewable energy;

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1 (f) Agriculture and food processing; 2 (g) Business management and administrative services; 3 (h) Software and computer services; (i) Research, development, and engineering services; 4 (j) Health services; 5 6 (k) Hospitality and tourism; and 7 (1) Any other industry designated as an in-demand occupation by the 8 committee.
