Executive Summary

This is the documentation of services and oral healthcare activities pursuant to the award contract for the period of February 1, 2021 through January 31, 2022, reporting the charitable oral health services provided in school districts and federally qualified health centers and the number of recipients and the placement of students receiving oral health training at a reduced fee in dental education programs.

Services and Oral Healthcare Activities

During the reporting period from February 1, 2021 to January 31, 2022, Creighton University School of Dentistry students treated 1,924 patients (in total) at the Charles Drew Health Center, Community Action Partnership of Western Nebraska, Douglas County Health Center, Good Neighbor Community Health Center, Heart Ministry Center, OneWorld Community Health Centers and Winnebago Dental Clinic through the Extramural Dental Education Program.

In addition, Healthy Smiles, a school-based dental program of the Creighton University School of Dentistry, provided care to 2,064 children in 12 low-income elementary schools with 75% or above eligibility in the free/reduced school lunch program.
