Medicaid Expansion Programs 249 (Administration) & 349 (Aid)

The Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Medicaid and Long-Term Care (MLTC), provides the following update regarding Medicaid Expansion Administrative and Aid policy decisions for the calendar month of February 2021:

Expansion was launched successfully on October 1, 2020. With benefits through Medicaid expansion now available, many details of the program have been finalized and will not require additional updates in this report unless changes occur. Details on enrollment for the month of February are below:

In February, DHHS announced that the state would not have federal decision on the Heritage Health Adult Demonstration Program's implementation plan in time to launch the program as scheduled on April 1, 2021. The HHA Demonstration Program would allow everyone currently receiving basic benefits to complete wellness and personal responsibility activities in order to qualify for Prime benefits. As such, the schedule of the program's implementation is yet to be determined. A press release with more information is available on the <u>DHHS website</u>.

Eligibility Operations continued to develop and refine training materials to support ongoing operations around Medicaid expansion. These materials include online and classroom-style training and process guides. Eligibility Operations is also preparing training materials to support the HHA Demonstration Program's implementation once a timeline for this is set.




Figure 1: HHA Phase 2 Implementation Timeline
