Summary of purpose and/or changes:

Angela Amack

This bill would amend the powers of Nebraska counties to allow them to authorize the permitless carrying of concealed weapons within their respective jurisdictions. The bill also includes harmonizing changes in the Nebraska Criminal Code and in the Concealed Handgun Permit Act. County-level permitless carry would not be authorized under LB 236 for persons who are otherwise prohibited from possessing such weapons under state or federal law.

Explanation of amendments:

The committee voted to adopt Committee Amendment 438:

8 Yes - Blood, Brewer, Halloran, Hansen M., Hunt, Lowe, McCollister, Sanders

The committee amendment would require that counties consult with their sheriff before passing the sort of ordinance contemplated by LB 236. It would also require persons engaged in the lawful permitless carrying of a concealed weapon to immediately inform any emergency responder in the event of an official contact. Finally, the amendment limits the power to pass a permitless carry ordinance to those counties that do not contain a city of the metropolitan or primary class.
