Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB661 would expand the offense of assault on certain employees.

Section 3 would amend Sec. 28-929.01 to create the term "public safety officer". This term would include officer, emergency responder, state correctional employee, certain DHHS employees, probation officers, and firefighters.

Section 4 would amend Sec. 28-929 to change the offense of first degree assault on certain employees to replace the list of employees with "public safety officer" and add public transportation driver.

Section 5 would amend Sec. 28-930 to change the offense of second degree assault on certain employees to replace the list of employees with "public safety officer" and add public transportation driver.

Section 6 would amend Sec. 28-931 to change the offense of third degree assault on certain employees to replace the list of employees with "public safety officer" and add public transportation driver.

Section 7 would amend Sec. 28-934 to expand the offense of assault with a bodily fluid against a public safety officer to include health care professionals and public transportation drivers.

Section 9 would amend Sec. 28-1351 to harmonize references to Sections 4-6.

Section 10 would amend Sec. 28-1354 to harmonize references to Sections 4-6.

Section 11 would amend Sec. 29-2221 to harmonize references to Section 4.

Explanation of amendments:

The definition of "public transportation driver" in Section 3 would exclude taxi drivers. AM612 would correct a typographical error.
