Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB 1143 repeals outdated statutes relating to health districts. Nebraska Revised Statutes Sections 71-1601 through 71-1625 are outright repealed and current statutes relating to Medicaid, the State Auditor, and Medically Handicapped Children's Services are updated.

Health districts were created in 1939 and are not currently used. Presently, local public health departments are made up of county health departments, district health departments formed by inter-local agreements between one or more counties, and a city/county health department.

- Sec. 1: Strikes "health district" and replaces with "county, district, or city-county health department" in NRS Section 13-2202, Local Government Miscellaneous Expenditure Act.
- Sec. 2: Adds "or city-county" to health departments in NRS Section 68-1405, Genetically Handicapped Persons Act.
- Sec 3: Strikes "health district" in NRS 84-304, Auditor of Public Accounts.
- Sec. 4: Repealer
