Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB 1402 appropriates \$25 million for FY2024-25 for the purpose of providing for education scholarships to be distributed through the office of the State Treasurer.

Nebraska Students who are (A) receiving and education scholarship for the first time and are entering kindergarten, sixth grade, or ninth grade in a qualified school or (B) transferring from a public school at which the student was enrolled for at least one semester immediately preceding the first semester for which the student received an education scholarship to a qualified school.

Qualified school is defined as any nongovernmental, privately operated elementary or secondary school located in this state that meets certain criteria.

Scholarship granting organizations may apply to the State Treasurer for a grant which shall be used to provide education scholarships to eligible students to pay the costs associated with attending a qualified school. LB1402 also provides prioritization criteria which applicants shall follow when awarding scholarships.

LB 1402 includes intent for the State Treasurer to continue making grants in FY2025-26 and each year thereafter, and includes intent that is the total amount of grants awarded in any fiscal year exceeds ninety percent of the appropriation for that fiscal year, the appropriation the following year shall be increased by 25%, not to exceed a maximum appropriation of \$100 million.

Section 2 is the emergency clause.

Explanation of amendments:

AM2679 strikes the original provisions and becomes the bill. AM2679 provides for education scholarships to be distributed through the office of the State Treasurer.

Nebraska Students who are (A) receiving and education scholarship for the first time and are entering kindergarten, sixth grade, or ninth grade in a qualified school or (B) transferring from a public school at which the student was enrolled for at least one semester immediately preceding the first semester for which the student received an education scholarship to a qualified school.

Qualified school is defined as any nongovernmental, privately operated elementary or secondary school located in this state that meets certain criteria.

Scholarship granting organizations may apply to the State Treasurer for a grant which shall be used to provide education scholarships to eligible students to pay the costs associated with attending a qualified school. LB1402 also provides prioritization criteria which applicants shall follow when awarding scholarships.

The annual limit on the total amount of grants awarded shall be twenty-five million for fiscal year 2024-25. For each fiscal year thereafter, the annual limit shall be calculated by taking the annual limit from the prior fiscal year and multiplying that amount by (a) one hundred twenty-five percent if the total amount of grants awarded in the prior fiscal year exceeded ninety percent of the annual limit for that fiscal year or (b) one hundred percent if the total amount of grants awarded did not exceed ninety percent. The annual limit may be increased as provided until it reaches one hundred million dollars. Thereafter, no further increases shall be allowed.

AM2679 includes intent to appropriate funds pursuant to the annual grant award limitations.

Section 2 is the emergency clause.
