- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 50-433, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2023, is
 amended to read:

3 50-433 (1) The Nebraska Sentencing Reform Task Force is created.

4 (2) The task force shall identify and recommend changes to 5 Nebraska's criminal justice laws, policies, and practices to improve 6 public safety and more effectively allocate Nebraska's criminal justice 7 system resources.

(3) The task force shall consist of the following members:

9 (a) The Governor or the Governor's designee;

10 (b) The Attorney General or the Attorney General's designee;

(c) Three members of the Judiciary Committee of the Legislature
 appointed by the Executive Board of the Legislative Council;

13 (d) Two representatives of law enforcement appointed by the14 Governor;

(e) Two county attorneys appointed by the Governor; and

16 (f) Two criminal defense attorneys with at least ten years'17 experience appointed by the Governor.

(4) The task force shall submit its first report to the Legislature
no later than November 15, 2023. The task force shall submit its second
report to the Legislature no later than November 15, 2024. The reports
shall be submitted electronically to the Clerk of the Legislature.

(5) Administrative and staff support for the task force shall be provided by any executive branch staff as directed by the Governor or by staff of the Judiciary Committee of the Legislature as directed by the chairperson of the Judiciary Committee.

(6) The task force terminates on December 31, <u>2025</u> 2024.
