- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 85-931, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is
 amended to read:

85-931 Graduate degree programs means shall mean those programs for
which the following degrees are awarded:

5 (1) First professional degree being the first earned degree in the 6 following fields: (a) Dentistry; (b) medicine, general; (c) optometry; 7 (d) osteopathic medicine; (e) pharmacy; (f) podiatry; (g) veterinary 8 medicine; (h) chiropractic; (i) law, general; (j) theology, general; and 9 (k) architecture, general;

10 <u>(2)(a)</u> <del>(2)</del> Master's degree being the earned degree carrying the 11 title Master. The master's degree is the first advanced graduate degree 12 conferred in professional programs and general academic and occupational 13 programs.

(b) Master's degree professional programs include, but are not 14 limited to: (i) (a) Engineering; (ii) (b) education; (iii) (c) allied 15 health professions; (iv) (d) nursing; (v) (e) architecture, specialties; 16 17 (vi) (f) community and regional planning; (vii) (g) dentistry; (viii) (h) medicine, specialties; (ix) (i) optometry; (x) (j) osteopathic medicine; 18 19 (xi) (k) pharmacy; (xii) (l) podiatry; (xiii) (m) social work; (xiv) (n) veterinary medicine; (xv) (o) chiropractic; (xvi) (p) law, specialties; 20 and (xvii) (q) theology, specialties. 21

22 (c) Master's degree programs in general academic and occupational 23 areas include, but are not limited to: (i) (a) Mathematics; (ii) (b) 24 languages; (iii) (c) biological and physical sciences; (iv) (d) letters; 25 (v) (e) fine arts; (vi) (f) social sciences; (vii) (g) agriculture and 26 natural resources; (viii) (h) communications; (ix) (i) business and 27 management; (x) (j) computer and information sciences; (xi) (k) home 28 economics; and (xii) (l) fine and applied arts; and

(3) Doctoral degree being an earned academic degree conveying the
title of Doctor. Doctoral degrees include, but are not limited to: Doctor
of Philosophy; Doctor of Education; and Doctor of Arts.
