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executive board does have a tremendous amount of authority in order to assume for the legislature the extent that they will, bearing in mind they will always have the opportunity to take final action on anything that this council might do. I think we ought to do more than we have in order to dignify and to bring about the things that are rightfully ours. In the area the office has an illustration that because we now have fifteen members in the Omaha delegation I think they ought to have a collective space in the city of Omaha, with rooms and facilities adequate in order to take care of fifteen senators during the time this session is in session and when we're not in session. In the area of Lincoln which has a similar thing that is a problem they will have to solve themselves because most of them have access to the state capitol and access to stenographic services and various other things that do not prevail out state. I think the people particular in Douglas County are entitled to this kind of an area of representation and members of that delegation are also entitled to those kind of services. And I would hope that with the cooperation of this body and I can assure you of one thing, I will not intentionally do anything with out calling your attention to something which would put this chairman in a very embarrassing position. I can only say I'm thankful, I'm grateful for your confidence and I'm sure I'll not misuse it.

CLERK: Mr. President don't we have a motion on your desk.

SPEAKER: The Clerk will read.

CLERK: Mr. President I move that there be no more than three members from any one district on the executive board of the legislative council as outlined in 50-40101, signed Senator Stromer.

SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes Senator Stromer.

SENATOR STROMER: Mr. Speaker and members, the new method we are using here for selecting the officers and the members to the executive board are outlined in a bill that was passed last year. I think the original intent of that bill was that each of the three districts can have three representatives from that board. According to the way that the law actually was written, it says that only two members at large and so for that reason that I make this motion it is not in conflict with what is in the law, I think it would merely clarify and go along with the intent of Senator Carstens.

SPEAKER: Any further discussion? Well lets second the motion. All those in favor of the motion say-aye, I think we had better have a machine vote. Would you read the motion again.

CLERK: The motion is that I move that no more than three members from anyone district, I move that there be no more than three members from any one district on the executive board as outline in 50-40101. Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I want to ask a question of information for procedure. If we adopt this amendment, what will be the procedure to see that it's complied with. I want a nomination to be made. Otherwise as I understand that the nominations can be promiscuous and then we will be limited to not over three members in any one of the districts. I would presume that in the case of the chairman and the case of the vice chairman and that would leave two in the remaining four districts, and the speaker is also a member of the executive board.

SPEAKER: Senator Stromer.

SENATOR STROMER: I think what we would have here then that also the officers that are included by law which are the speaker, the chairman, the vice-chairman, would also then come under this particular motion.

SENATOR CARPENTER: (inaudible) procedure would do if you put it into effect if the body adopts it, I have no (inaudible) either way. It would seem to me Mr. Chairman it might be practical to recess if we adopt this motion for ten or fifteen minutes to
