**SPEAKER:** Senator Chambers would you like to speak to that comment?

**SPEAKER:** Alright, the executive board of the legislative council will meet tomorrow at 1:30, Senator Carpenter, in the legislative hearing room. Senator Duis.

**SENATOR DUIS:** Mr. Chairman I would also like to call a meeting of the rule committee, not the rules committee of the Legislature but the rules committee that's studying the rules and regulations of all state agencies, and as the Clerk tells me we don't have a name, we'll call ourself 88-something. We would like, and I would like very much to have a meeting of this committee at 9:00 in the morning, now if it's not possible will you please let yourself be known now. Is there anybody from Omaha, Ernie can you be here at 9:00? Is there anyone who can't be here at 9:00 in the morning for a meeting of this committee? Then there will be a meeting of this committee at 9:00 in the morning sir.

**SPEAKER:** Thank you Senator Duis, is there any more business to come before this body? Senator Hasebroock do you have a motion? Mr. Clerk do you have anything on your desk?

**CLERK:** I just have the motion to adjourn.

**SENATOR HASEBROOCK:** Mr. Chairman I move that we adjourn until 10:00 tomorrow morning.

**SPEAKER:** You have heard the motion, all those in favor of adjourning to 10:00 a.m. tomorrow morning say aye, opposed no. We stand adjourned.
