SPEAKER: The Legislature will now please come to order. Now Mr. Clerk is there anything on your desk?

CLERK: We need the call to roll.

SPEAKER: Roll call. The clerk will record.

CLERK: A quorum present Mr. President. Mr. President Senator Skarda has asked to be excused on Monday, January 8th.
