Senator Hasebroock voting aye. Have you all voted? The clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: 33 ayes, Mr. President, 0 nays on the motion to advance.

SPEAKER: LB 3 is advanced. General File consideration to LB 4. Clerk will read the title.

CLERK: Read title. LB 4.

SPEAKER: The chair recognizes Senator Luedtke.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Mr. President, I move that LB 4 be advanced to the E & R Initial. Mr. President, members of the Legislature, LB 4 is another one of the same type of bills. This one eliminates or strikes the word magistrate in reference to magistrate pursuant to LB 1032 of the last session.

SPEAKER: Any further discussion of the bill? The question is shall LB 4 be advanced from General File to E & R Initial. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed no.

CLERK: Senator Hasebroock voting aye.

SPEAKER: Once again have you all voted? The clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: 36 ayes, Mr. President, 0 nays on the motion to advance.

SPEAKER: Bill is advanced.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Mr. President.

SPEAKER: Senator Luedtke.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: I am going to request that LB 5 be laid over till I get some information from Revisor of Statutes which I do not as of yet have.

SPEAKER: Senator Luedtke is asking unanimous consent to pass over LB 5. Are there objections from the floor? There are none. It is so ordered and we will move to the General File consideration of LB 6. Senator Fellman would you turn off the lights to the desk. Thank you.

CLERK: Read Title. LB 6. There are amendments, Mr. President, authored by Senator Luedtke.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Mr. President, I move the adoptions of the amendments with the explanation these amendments are merely supplemental to the type of change brought about by LB 1032 last time with reference to municipal courts and this was just overlooked by the Revisor in drafting LB 6. It is another reference to the Municipal Courts. If you want to have it read it would be alright with me but that is the explanation of the amendment.

SPEAKER: Does anyone want the amendments read? I believe the Clerk could tell the --

CLERK: The only change, Mr. President, is appear before the court and the word "county" is stricken is the only change and then it would have the emergency clause.

SPEAKER: The question is shall--is there any further discussion of the amendments. The question is shall the amendments be adopted? All those in favor say aye, those opposed say no. Amendments are adopted. Senator Luedtke.
