SENATOR PROUD: It was my thought that when we adjourned we adjourned until tomorrow morning.

SENATOR DUIS: Thank you, Senator Proud. Then I would ask if the Rules Committee would meet with me at say 3:30 this afternoon.

SPEAKER: Is that 2:30?

SENATOR DUIS: 3:30.

SPEAKER: 3:30.

SENATOR DUIS: 3:30. Senator Warner has a meeting till 3:00 and the meeting will be in the Legislative Council room if I might clear that with the Clerk now.

CLERK: As far as I know there is nothing in there. I don't always get word of scheduled meetings though.

SENATOR DUIS: The Rules Committee then will meet at 3:30 in the Legislative Council room unless they see me in the meantime--any different. This will be an Executive meeting.

SPEAKER: Good. Is there any other business on the desk.

SENATOR PROUD: Mr. President, there is one other thing. The clerk has suggested to me that there are a lot of bills floating around somewhere. We know that because we know how many bills the bill drafter has prepared but they are not on the clerk's desk and I certainly urge you if you are going to introduce a bill to get it on the clerk's desk. There is no rule requiring that you do so. It has been my experience, whatever it is worth, it is better to have these bills in early before we get too cantankerous.
