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when we have these rather unimportant matters to be taken up, not the time on the floor, but to merely sign our names that we want somebody to consider something.

SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes speaker emeritus Hasebrook.

SENATOR HASEBROOCK: Mr. President and members of the legislature, I would urge that we return the rules, turn it back to the rules committee of the Carpenter motion. I urge that we support it I think we can find that we can do a better job than by having another hearing, I think some of these things can be worked out better than they can here on the floor, so I would urge that you vote for Carpenter's motion and return it to the rules committee.

SPEAKER: Is there any further discussion of the Carpenter motion? Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: Only in answer to Senator Luedtke, Senator Luedtke I'm totally sorry that I didn't check with you to be sure that you could be present, but as of now I state, please tell me when you can and we'll arrange all of ourselves to suit you.

SPEAKER: Is there any further discussion of the motion? The question is shall the rule change be referred back to the committee? All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote no. The Chair requires 25 votes to bind the body. Once again the chair will ask have you all voted. The Clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: 39 ayes, no nays, Mr. President on the motion to return.

SPEAKER: So ordered, the motion carried and the rule is returned. Do we have other rule changes on the desk?

CLERK: None.

SPEAKER: Are there any other motions on the desk? The Chair recognizes Senator Carpenter, for what purpose do you rise Senator?

SENATOR CARPENTER: To move we return to general file and take up the two bills that are bracketed. It's my understanding that someone will make a motion probably to refer them to a committee for a hearing. If that happens that'll dispose and expidite them.

SPEAKER: Stand by. Senator Carpenter has asked unanimous consent to take up the two bills on general file, are there any objections? Are there any objections? Senator Goodrich do you object?

SENATOR GOODRICH: What two bills, is it 5 and 7?

SPEAKER: That is correct sir.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Frankly they were bracketed for Wednesday, I believe that's tomorrow, and I have to talk to Luedtke on number 7 and number 5 I have no interest in, but number 7, oh wait a minute, number 5 is that barber thing, then I haven't got my answer back from them either, so -

SPEAKER: The chair is asking yes or no, do you object?

SENATOR GOODRICH: Yes, I'm sorry to object-

SPEAKER: Thank you, your unanimous consent is not granted, Senator Carpenter.
