SENATOR MOYLAN: Mr. President, members of the legislature, I believe we have ample work here that we should use every day that we have from now on, there are several bills on the board there yet, I think by Monday we should have plenty of bills available that we should not take another day off this time of year, when a good many of the members of the legislature would appreciate this time at the end of the session. Thank you.

SPEAKER: Is there further comment? Senator Stull.

SENATOR STULL: Mr. Speaker I'd certainly want to second Senator Stromer's motion, I'd like to go home this week end and this would certainly give me one additional day, and there is a good many people going to be absent anyway Monday, and I would appreciate added consideration.

SPEAKER: Senator Skarda were you asking for the floor? Senator Rasmussen, then Senator Duis. Senator Rasmussen. Oh, Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President I believe that I would support the motion to adjourn until Tuesday, I looked at the board up there and I think probably the best thing to do is to ask the Clerk if there is anything particular that is coming up. I'm concerned about our 90 days, if we only meet for 30 minutes, and only introduce two, three or four bills, we might wind up with another one of those 90 days gone.

SPEAKER: Mr. Clerk do you have a comment?

CLERK: Yes Mr. Speaker, and Senator Duis we advanced all but about three bills off general file, so the only thing that appears to be urgent is LB 253 which Senator Marvel placed on general file this morning indicating that he was in a hurry for that, but otherwise there is not too much up there.

SPEAKER: Well then why not advance the bill from general file that was put on there this morning and that would leave us without any particular situation at all?

CLERK: I don't think that Senator Marvel is in that big a hurry. You might ask him.

SPEAKER: I don't think he is either, I think he just wanted to get it on general file to get it across the board, but this would certainly help us with our 90 day limit. Senator Stromer.

SENATOR STROMER: Yes, Mr. Speaker I have a question for the Clerk, and that is how many people also do we have excused for Monday, I think there are quite a number aren't there four or five.

CLERK: Three is all so far that we have.

SPEAKER: Senator Dickinson.

SENATOR DICKINSON: Well I'm assuming there are committee hearings for Monday, how does this affect this situation, many Senators are going to have to be in attendance, sometime during the day.

SPEAKER: Is there any comment on that, Senator Dickinson this will not affect committee hearings, of course the committee members are duty or conscious bound to be here, but we would still go ahead with our committee hearings.

CLERK: The only hearing set for Monday is Education has two bills, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: Now are there further comments? If not are you ready for the question, now Mr. Clerk is the machine still out of order?

CLERK: Yes.
