SENATOR RASMUSSEN: I think every thing has been said.

SPEAKER: Are you ready for the question? All those in favor of suspension of the rules in order to take up Senator Rasmussen's resolution, vote aye, those opposed vote no. Have you all voted, this requires 30 votes. Have you all voted, call of the house is being called for, do I see five hands? I see more than five hands, the Clerk will clear the board and then indicate your presence. Please indicate your presence. The house is under call all Senators are required to remain in their seats. The question is shall the rules be suspended to take up Senator Rasmussen's resolution?

CLERK: Senator Burbach voting aye on the motion to suspend the rules.

SPEAKER: My tally board here reads, how many votes do we have Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: 28.

SPEAKER: There are 28 votes now recorded for suspension.

CLERK: Senator Cal Carsten voting aye on the original motion.

SPEAKER: The motion has been made that the call be raised. Is there a second? It's been moved and seconded that the call be raised, all those in favor of raising the call vote aye, those opposed vote no.

CLERK: Senator Simpson voting aye on the original motion.

SPEAKER: Mr. Clerk have you activated the board?

CLERK: No.

SPEAKER: This is to, Senator Snyder moved to raise the call, this is to raise the call. Have you all voted. The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 35 ayes Mr. President on the motion to raise the call.

SPEAKER: The call has been raised, the Clerk will announce the vote on the original motion.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 8 nays, the remainder not voting.

SPEAKER: Senator Rasmussen you have achieved the required majority to take up your motion, now a motion will be in order for you to make to adopt your resolution.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: Mr. Speaker, fellow members of the legislature, I make the motion that we adopt this resolution.

SPEAKER: Is there any discussion? Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, members of the legislature, would it be in order to amend this resolution to bring it up to date, in that we're profoundly grateful that the war in Viet Nam is over.

SPEAKER: Senator Kelly certainly a motion to amend the resolution is in order, however, Senator Rasmussen your resolution, does it in any way refer to the Viet Nameese conflict?

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: No.

SPEAKER: Since it does not, Senator Kelly I am going to rule that it's not germane to the resolution, however, you have every right to make any motion or to introduce any resolution you care to.
