SENATOR DICKINSON: We've had several comments concerning tax exempt status of this, organizations and institutions and so forth, we keep, we complain about this but we keep adding to them, now I know some Senior Citizens homes that are quite plush, they need no help from anyone, they're non profit organizations, but, I sincerely mean they're plush places to live and this great. I'm greatly concerned about continuing to add even these minute things to tax exempt status. Thank you.

SPEAKER: Is there any further discussion of the bill? Senator Maresh, do you wish to close?

SENATOR MARESH: Mr. President and members of the legislature, I think this is a good bill, otherwise, I believe it it wasn't I don't believe two of the members of the Public Service Commission would appeared in favor of the bill and there is a problem in the rural area I hope you will vote to advance this bill to E&R.

SPEAKER: The motion is, the question is, shall LB 54 as amended be advanced from general file to E&R initial, all thos in favor vote aye, all those oppose vote no. We are voting on the advancement of LB 54 from general file to E&R initial. Once again the Chair will inquire, have you all voted? The clerk will record.

CLERK: 34 ayes, no nays, 15 not voting Mr. President.

SPEAKER: The bill is advanced. Next take up is the general file consideration of LB 128, do we have time?

CLERK: I have a motion Mr. President.

SPEAKER: Senator Stromer. (talking in the background)

CLERK: Mr. President LB 128.

SPEAKER: Do you want to read the title? Senator Stromer.

SENATOR STROMER: I was just going to say I think we could probably at least get started. But I'm sure there is going to be more discussion when we have time, but we can get started with the committee amendments and everything else.

SPEAKER: Let's move while we can. The clerk will read the title.

CLERK: Title Read LB 128.

SPEAKER: Very good, Senator Kremer.

SENATOR KREMER: Mr. Chairman, do you want to take these Committee amendments one at a time, I think we should, they're all distinctly different, take them one at a time -

SPEAKER: It's your pleasure -

SENATOR KREMER: If you refer to the committee amendments, we will take #1 on page 2, line 2, strike limited special and insert farm husbandry, now these limited special permits pertain to those people below 16 years of age that are allowed under previous legislation to operate a farm tractor or farm vehicle on the highway, so the term farm husbandry which applies to that would be a better word, so I move the adoption of this amendment.

SPEAKER: Is there any further discussion of the amendment #1 by the committee? Senator Dickinson your light is still on do you want to be recognized? Thank you sir, any further discussion of the amendment? All those in favor of the amendment please say aye, those opposed say no, so ordered the amendment is adopted. Going to move to amendment #2, Senator Kremer.
