SENATOR STROMER: Mr. President, could I call for a record vote, please.

SPEAKER: A record vote is called. The question is shall LB 9 be indefinitely postponed. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote no. Have you all voted? The clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: Read.

SPEAKER: The bill is advanced. Do we have any other unfinished business on the desk.

SPEAKER: Senator Carpenter would have voted to advance the bill. Very good. There is a motion before us to adjourn until 9:00 tomorrow morning. Is there any other business to come before the body. The chair recognizes--what's the matter. Senator
