SENATOR SNYDER: Alright.

SPEAKER: Motion is to bracket, well unanimous consent motion to bracket LB 69 until next Wednesday, are there objections to bracketing the bill? Are there objections, Senator Nore do you object, yes or no.

SENATOR NORE: I do not object, but I'd like to say a few words.

SPEAKER: There is nothing before us to discuss. Senator Fellman do you object yes or no.

SENATOR NORE: Will Senator Snyder yield to a question?

SPEAKER: Turn off his mike. Senator Fellman do you object?

SENATOR NORE: Will Senator Snyder yield to a question?

SPEAKER: The motion before us is the unanimous consent motion to bracket LB 69, there is nothing else to discuss? Do you object, thank you. Senator Murphy, do you wish to be recognized? Do you object to the unanimous consent motion? Alright so ordered, LB 69 is bracketed on select file. The next order of business is LB 39 on select file. Senator Nore for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR NORE: A point of personal privilege, to just say a few words about LB 69.

SPEAKER: It's not before the body Senator.

SENATOR NORE: Could I have that unanimous consent.

SPEAKER: Pardon me.

SENATOR NORE: Could I have the consent, the unanimous consent to just say a -

SPEAKER: It has the unanimous consent to bracket until Wednesday, it's not under discussion, we are now on LB 39 on select file.

SENATOR NORE: Well could I have a point of personal privilege?

SPEAKER: Not really to discuss the bill, no sir.

SENATOR NORE: Okay I'll discuss the philosophy then.

SPEAKER: Go ahead.

SENATOR NORE: This particular thing, I won't mention the bill, but it revolves around the philosophy, which I think that Senator Snyder believes in and that is we are gradually eroding away the checks and, the check and balance system in our government. Having an appointment, having people appointed, on the surface you know a dictator is beautiful, it's heavenly, but it depends on which dictator you have, so in the area of Omaha it depends on which Mayor you have, so I would say that, I would always take my calculated risk on having the people elect folks to office instead of having them appointed. That's my philosophy. I'll take that calculated risk, in a democracy you take that calculated risk. But we've always taken it - nothing, nothing.

SPEAKER: We are ready for the select file consideration of LB 39.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Mr. President I move the advancement of LB 39 to E&R for engrossment.

SPEAKER: The motion is to advance LB 39 to E&R for engrossment, is there need for discussion. All those in favor of advancing the bill please say aye, those opposed say no. So ordered the bill is advanced.
