

should instruct these election commissioners and/or county clerks to see that this mailing goes out and in this fashion, I think their list will be kept in current fashion.

SPEAKER: Chair recognizes Senator Marsh and then Senator Nore:

SENATOR MARSH: I have a question for Senator Stahmer.

SPEAKER: Senator Stahmer, will you yield to the question?

SENATOR STAHMER: Yes.

SENATOR MARSH: Is this requested by the Chief Election Officer who is the Secretary of State, is this his suggestion for handling this problem?

SENATOR STAHMER: No, it is not.

SPEAKER: Chair recognizes Senator Nore.

SENATOR NORE: Mr. President, fellow members, I don't think this would work. Someone could move a block away and the letter would be returned, moved. Where did he move. It just wouldn't work. You'd have hundreds of folks that were still in the districts that would be taken off the list.

SPEAKER: Chair next recognizes Senator Anderson. We're speaking on the Stahmer amendment, L.B.198.

SENATOR ANDERSON: In terms of the Stahmer amendment, what he is suggesting is basically the procedure that was used in Douglas County. The one assurance that I would make that if this amendment is adopted, Senator Cavanaugh and I would be in with the bill next year to modify it. We, what we're asking for is a year to come up with a procedure that can be cleared through all of the County Clerks to do this very thing and for that reason I plan to oppose the amendment.

SPEAKER: Chair next recognizes--Senator Johnson, did you wish to be recognized? Senator Nore, your light is still on. Do you want to speak again? Thank you. Does anybody else wish to speak on the Stahmer amendment? Senator Stahmer, do you care to close? The question is, shall the Stahmer amendment be adopted. All those in favor, say aye, those opposed say no. Motion failed.

CLERK: (inaudible) all the amendments, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: Thank you. Senator Anderson, we're back to you with 198 as amended.

SENATOR ANDERSON: Mr. President, I move that L.B. 198 as amended, be advanced to E&R for initial.

SPEAKER: Motion is to advance the bill. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: 34 ayes, 4 nays, 11 not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: L.B. 198 as amended is advanced. We will move to consideration of L.B. 19, that's Senator Burbach's bill.

CLERK: Legislative Bill 19, introduced by the Committee on Taxation and Equalization signed by Senator Burbach, Chairman. (read) There are lengthy committee amendments, Mr. President, which are set out in full in the journal.

SPEAKER: Chair recognizes Senator Burbach.
